As part of the Village's commitment to communicating more effectively with its residents, business owners, and visitors, Village staff have recently completed an all-new redesign of the Village's web site, [www.barrington-il.gov](http://www.barrington-il.gov).

The goal of the website re-development project was to improve the graphics, navigation, functionality, and communication of the current website, which had been created in 2003. As a result of tremendous efforts by staff, with Board and resident input, the new site is fresh, lively, and more engaging for users and better reflects the hometown character and spirit of the Village.

Real-time updates to the site and the calendar will now



enable residents and businesses to see all Village meetings and events in one place. The revised site also has an enhanced search function and the ability by Village Staff to create online surveys to ask residents and businesses their opinions about relevant topics. Coming in the near future will be the ability to submit a service request online, submit forms online, and request building permits online. An interactive FAQ section and Business Directory are also planned.

Navigation of the site has been improved by providing users with multiple ways of accessing information on the site. The main navigation bar features a drop-down menu entitled "I Want To," which will quickly direct users to the information they are looking for. The main navigation also includes audience-driven navigation so residents, businesses, and visitors can quickly find information unique to them.

## *Canadian National Is in the News Again*

*Over the past few months, Canadian National has been in the news again due to several safety incidents on its rail lines. On April 28, CN executives were summoned to Washington to explain why they under-reported issues on the rail line during November and December 2009. As you know, I have been following the company's dealings carefully, and with just over one year into CN's operations on the EJ&E, the Village of Barrington and the TRAC Coalition continue to question CN's disclosures and reporting of rail issues on its lines.*

*Thanks to TRAC's monitoring of CN's reports to the Surface Transportation Board (STB), the Board finally increased its oversight activities of CN's operations on the EJ&E at the beginning of this year. For the past year, TRAC has been communicating to the Board that CN's operations reports have not been accurate based on the complaints that concerned citizens have registered at [www.fightrailcongestion.com](http://www.fightrailcongestion.com). CN has continually underreported the problems its operations are causing in the region even at a time when only 10% of the expected additional freight traffic is running on the EJ&E.*

*CN's errors and omissions became public when the STB ordered CN to explain on April 28 why it provided the Board with erroneous data that under-counted instances of blocked crossings by over 1,400 times. The Board is expected to make a decision as to what the consequences of those errors and omissions will be after a May 28 comment deadline has passed. We hope that the Board will take strong punitive action that deters CN from any future underreporting or misstatements to the Board and the public. We will continue to voice our concerns to the Board about this issue, as well as the other oversight problems that still need to be addressed.*

*Meanwhile, things continue to progress on the legal front with CN. On April 7, both impacted communities and CN filed their initial legal briefs with the U.S. Appellate Court. We argued that the STB did not go far enough in mitigating the problems that will be caused by CN's traffic on the line. CN argued that the Board had no authority to add mitigating conditions to the decision approving the transaction. In fact, CN claimed that the only mitigation that is allowable is the mitigation that the railroad voluntarily offered to undertake. While we would strongly argue that point, the responsibility for defending the Board's prerogatives in this area belongs to the STB, which will be filing its response on June 7. Throughout the summer, all parties will be filing additional briefs in response to each filing with final briefs from every party due to the Court by August 6. ## Comprehensive Plan

On June 8 at 7:00pm in Village Hall, the public is invited to a special kickoff meeting for the Village's Comprehensive Plan process. Every 10 years the Village incorporates into its long-range planning an update of the Village's Comprehensive Plan. The current plan was last updated in 2000, so the Village will be undertaking this project in 2010. The new plan will cover topics such as municipal boundaries, intergovernmental cooperation, land use, Village Center, housing, transportation, the environment, and economic development. In addition, all existing maps, charts, and data tables will be reviewed and revised. It will take one year to complete the project.

A key component of the update involves public participation. Following the kickoff meeting in June, a series of neighborhood meetings will be held with residents throughout the summer and fall. These meetings will give residents the opportunity to comment on the policies and recommendations of the Comprehensive Plan and raise other issues specific to their neighborhood and regarding the Village in general. The first neighborhood meeting will take place on Wednesday, June 23rd at 7:00 pm at the Barrington Area Library. This meeting will specifically be for the Roslyn Road and Jewel Park neighborhoods. ## Safely Dispose of Prescription Drugs

The Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) runs a Prescription Drug/Sharps Disposal Program for its member-communities. This program ensures environmentally safe disposal and guards against potential theft associated with disposing of old medications. The program is for residentially-generated unused prescriptions, expired over-the-counter drugs, and needles known as "sharps." No commercial or institutional waste is accepted and ID's will be checked. The program runs the first Saturday of every month from 1:00–3:00 p.m. at the Public Safety Facility, located at 400 N. ## Barrington Approves New Building Codes

Since 2003, the Village has been enforcing the 2000 International Codes and the 1996 National electrical Code. In order to stay current with our surrounding communities, comply with Illinois state law, and to meet current construction industry standards, the Village adopted an updated set of Building Codes in April, including:

- 2008 National Electric Code
- 2009 International Building Code
- 2009 International Residential Code
- 2009 International Mechanical Code
- 2009 International Energy Conservation Code
- 2009 International Fire Code
- 2009 International Fuel Gas Code
- Local amendments to the above

The new codes became effective for all permits submitted on or after April 1, 2010. For more information regarding these changes please contact the Engineering and Building Department at (847) 304-3460.

## Sidewalks Coming to Two School Neighborhoods

In December 2009 the Village received \$250,000 from the Illinois Department of Transportation's "Safe Routes to School" program to install sidewalks in our neighborhoods for safe passage for students walking to neighborhood schools. The Village will use the funds to construct new sidewalks near Roslyn Road and Grove Avenue schools. The areas designated for sidewalks are: Exmoor from Northwest Highway to Roslyn Road; Waverly Road from Prospect Avenue to Cumnor Avenue, and Summit Street from Hillside to Illinois Street. Engineering for the project began this spring of 2010, with construction proposed for the summer of 2011.

## Water conservation tips:

Run dishwashers and washing machines with a full load only (unless reduced fill settings are available)

Take shorter showers. Turn down the faucets and try a low-flow showerhead. A typical five-minute shower can use over 40 gallons of water. A shower of seven minutes or longer can consume more water than a bath.

A typical toilet leak can waste thousands of gallons of water each year.

Don't leave water running when shaving, brushing teeth, washing hair, or washing dishes.

A small drip from a leaking faucet can waste 70 gallons of water each day. Replace worn washers.

Insulate hot water pipes between the heater and the faucets to reduce the amount of water that must be run to get hot water.

When washing a car, rinse it once. Use a bucket of soapy water to wash it, and then rinse it once more quickly. Taking a car to a car wash may save water since many commercial installations recycle their water.

1 inch of rain or watering over a 7 to 10 day period is sufficient to maintain a healthy lawn. There is no need to water everyday, as it promotes weak, shallow, rooted grass.

Grass beginning to turn brown during dry conditions has become dormant and will revive after a normal rainfall.

Reset automatic irrigation systems to meet the changing Village water status. Watering during the morning hours is best for your lawn.

Water lawns and gardens early in the morning to avoid evaporation loss.

Avoid sprinklers that produce a fine mist. Too much water is lost to the wind and to evaporation.

Sweep sidewalks and driveways instead of washing them.
