The Village Board invites all residents to attend a Town Hall Meeting on Thursday, September 30, 2010 from 7:00 p.m. until 8:30 p.m. at the Barrington Village Hall. The Town Hall Meeting is a wonderful opportunity for the public to discuss important issues with Village officials and offer suggestions for how to make Barrington an even greater place to live, work, and play.

Topics to be discussed include economic and community development, including updates on the project at Hough

and Main Streets and projects to continue to attract new businesses to the Village; updates on the Canadian National railroad situation; upcoming events; the holiday season and all of its festivities; and many other topics. There will be a question-and-answer session and an opportunity to provide direct feedback to Village officials.

# Village News You Can Use

## Smoke Testing Results

In July the Village conducted “smoke testing” of the sanitary sewers in certain parts of the Village to assist us in determining where storm water was entering into the sanitary sewers. During this process we discovered several areas that appear to have a cross connection between the storm and sanitary sewers. We are currently in the process of performing additional investigation to pinpoint the cross connection so repairs can be scheduled. We will keep you informed of any further action as more information becomes available.



## Let the Chipper Chop Up Your Trees

It's Chipper time again! In early October the Chipper will come through your neighborhood to chop up all those tree branches. Please have all material out to the curb by 7:00am on your designated Monday morning (see below). Branches may be up to 10" in diameter and at least 4' in length. Stack branches neatly in a long, low pile on the parkway, with the cut end facing the curb. Public Works crews cannot pick up material on private property. The following items cannot be picked up: root balls & stumps; building materials; anything with nails, wire or bolts; any material placed in a box or garbage can; grass, leaves or material other than woody branch material. The chipper will make only one pass through your neighborhood.

## *Village Excels in Emergency Planning*

*An important date comes this month: September 11, the National Day of Service and Remembrance. Fittingly, September is also National Preparedness Month. I want to assure all Village residents that for our elected officials and staff, emergency preparedness is not just something we focus on one month of the year—it is something we work on every day.*

*The Village has an Emergency Management Team, with members from Administration, Fire, Police and Public Works. This team meets regularly to plan and continually upgrade our hazard mitigation, response and recovery capabilities. This ongoing effort enhances collaboration between departments; to further the Village goal to do everything we can to protect our community in the event of a disaster. We also coordinate our efforts with the school district, fellow municipalities, county and state government, and the private sector.*

*As part of national preparedness efforts, the federal government has established the National Incident Management System (“NIMS”), which requires local governments to adhere to universal standards for planning, training, and implementing emergency response. I’m proud to say that the Village of Barrington meets and exceeds all federal requirements, and is recognized throughout the State of Illinois as being an active and highly competent emergency management agency.*

*One of the most important aspects of any community’s preparedness is the readiness of its individual residents and businesses. I encourage you to review your family preparations by visiting [www.ready.gov](http://www.ready.gov), a website devoted to helping you prepare, plan and stay informed. A few minutes of preparation now is insurance that your family will be better protected throughout the year.*

*On a related note, the Barrington Police and Fire Departments are holding their annual open house on October 2, 2010. This is a great chance for your family to learn first-hand about some of the services and equipment we use to protect the community. I encourage you to take advantage of this opportunity, by stopping by the Public Safety Facility and chatting with the employees who are there to protect you.*
