Historic District: FACT OR FICTION

Barrington is home to one of the most prestigious Historical Districts in Illinois. As spring and summer approach, many residents in the Historical District are considering exterior improvements to their homes but may be deterred because they believe that the approval process is too cumbersome. Listed below are just a few of the many misconceptions about the Village's Historic District that we have heard along with the facts.

"I cannot make exterior improvements to my home in the Historical District without going before the Architectural Review Commission."

FICTION - Many exterior improvements including but not limited to roof replacement, gutter replacement and siding repairs can be approved administratively (no commission review required) by obtaining a standard construction permit. Painting does not require a construction permit.



"Additions to the front and side of historic structures are not permitted."

FICTION - The Historical District Design Guidelines recommend that additions be located at the rear of the building, be in scale with the original structure and do not result in the loss of overall architectural character. However, all additions (including side and front) are evaluated by the Architectural Review Commission under the same set of standards.

"I cannot replace my windows."

FICTION - Replacement windows on noncontributing structures may be approved administratively by obtaining a standard construction permit. All replacement windows must be historically dimensioned and must be wood. Windows on contributing structures should be restored rather than replaced. Staff can help provide information on window restoration. If you feel your windows are beyond restoration, the Architectural Review Commission is happy to review your request by conducting an in-home inspection of your windows.

"I cannot replace my old wood siding with vinyl or aluminum siding."

FACT - Improvements to historic buildings should enhance the structure's historic character by rehabilitating or restoring the original materials whenever possible. When original materials cannot be rehabilitated or restored, the original material should not be replaced with synthetic materials such as aluminum and/or vinyl.

Fire Hydrant Flushing Scheduled May 1 - May 18

The Village conducts a semi-annual flushing of the water distribution system to eliminate as much mineral content as possible from the domestic water supply. Fire hydrant flushing removes a considerable amount of loose mineral content and "settleable" solids that accumulate in the water supply system over a period of time. Fire hydrant flushing operations will be completed from May 1 through May 18, 2011 and will be conducted during the evening hours between 10:30 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. for residents in the Village, and between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. for those areas we service outside of the Village. Customers may experience discoloration, low water pressure, and rusty water during flushing operations. These symptoms may occur the entire two week flushing period, even when flushing may not be in your immediate area. Although water may be discolored, it is safe to drink; however, until the water runs clear, it is advisable to avoid washing clothes, especially white fabrics. Village News You Can Use

Coexisting with the Wildlife in Our Community

There have been several recent reports involving coyotes and foxes in the Village. Last year, the Village hosted an informational meeting regarding living with wildlife. Tim Preuss, Lake County Forest Preserve District, gave a presentation that can be found on the Village's website at www.barrington-il.gov.



There are no known incidents of these animals attacking humans in Illinois. Although these species can be somewhat of a nuisance, they do provide a benefit. Both coyotes and foxes prey on small mammals, such as voles, mice, and rabbits. They also feed on geese eggs, which helps to control the geese population. Although it is safe to live near these wild animals, there are several things you can do for you and your pets safety:

- Do not feed or attempt to pet coyotes or foxes.
- Keep your trash well contained.
- Use squirrel-proof bird feeders and keep seed off the ground, as much as possible. Bird seed attracts small rodents, which, will attract coyotes and foxes.
- When walking your dog, keep them on a leash. Do not leave small pets unattended while they are outside.
- Keep your pets' shots up to date.
- In the unlikely event that a coyote approaches you, do not run. Yell, stand up straight and wave your arms (the goal is to make yourself appear larger), or throw something at the coyote to scare it away.

It is important to recognize that coyotes are a permanent fixture in Illinois' rural, suburban and urban areas. Seeing a coyote(s) cross a field, backyard, golf course, road, etc. does not necessarily constitute a problem or a dangerous situation for humans or domestic animals. Coyote population reduction (removing some or all of the coyotes in an area) is usually unrealistic and always temporary. Removal of coyotes also requires time, effort and funding. Removal can only be authorized by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) District Wildlife Biologist.

Arbor Day Celebration - Friday April 29

In celebration of Arbor Day on Friday, April 29, Commonwealth Edison will donate trees to be planted at area grade schools. The Council of Garden Clubs will give a presentation to students, where they will learn how trees produce food and energy for people and wildlife, how properly selected and planted trees conserve energy, and much more.

Let the Chipper Chop Up Your Trees

It's Spring Chipper time again! In early May, the chipper will come through your neighborhood to chop up all those tree branches. Please have all material out to the curb by 7:00 a.m. on your designated Monday morning (see left box). Branches may be up to 10 inches in diameter and at least 4 feet in length. Stack branches neatly in a long, low pile on the parkway, with the cut end facing the curb. Public Works crews cannot pick up material on private property. The following items cannot be picked up: root balls and stumps; building materials; anything with nails, wire or bolts; any material placed in a box or garbage can; grass, leaves or material other than woody branch material.

Spring Clean-Up Time is Here

With springtime upon us again it is time to clean up and attend to property maintenance issues. The Village has a Property Maintenance Code that is in effect to maintain a standard for which we all need to abide by to ensure that the quality of life for you, your neighbors, and the Village is upheld. Here are some tips to keep in mind as the weather improves and residents return to the outdoors:

- Grass and weed growth maintained no higher than 10" inches in height
- No inoperative, unlicensed, or unregistered motor vehicles may be kept outside, nor can any be in a state of major disassembly, disrepair, or in the process of being stripped
- Boats, trailers, recreational vehicles may be kept on driveways for 48 hours only
- Exterior surfaces must be kept free of loose and peeling paint
- Wood exterior surfaces must be kept free of rot and decay
- Window and door screens must be kept in good repair
- Exterior property and premises must be kept free from any accumulation of rubbish, garbage, and debris
- Trash containers must be maintained with lids and properly placed on your property outside of the required setbacks
- Sump pump discharge outlets must be kept a minimum of 10' feet from the property line

Also remember to clean up after your pets on both public and private property. For more information regarding property maintenance please contact the Engineering and Building Department at (847) 304-3460. Abiding by these simple rules helps to make Barrington a great place to live, work, and play!
