## Public Safety Pension Reform

On Thursday, December 30, 2010, Illinois Governor Pat Quinn signed the Public Safety Pension Reform legislation approved by the Illinois General Assembly. The changes included in this legislation should lower the cost of public safety pensions for municipalities and represent a positive first step towards pension sustainability. The legislation includes a number of changes that will have a positive impact on the cost and funding of the public safety pensions, these include:

### Benefits Changes for New Hires Beginning January 1, 2011

- normal retirement age of 55 (currently age 50);
- early retirement at age 50 with a 6% reduction for each year prior to age 55;
- pensionable salary cap of \$106,800 indexed to 1/2 % of the CPI-U;
- final average salary calculated using the last 8 of 10 years (currently final day's salary);
- survivor benefit of 66 2/3% of pension earned at date of death (currently 100% of pension); and
- cost-of-living adjustments beginning the year after a retiree or survivor turns age 60 with annual increases equaling the lesser of 3% simple or 1/2 of CPI-U (currently 3% compounded each year after pension becomes payable).

### Funding Changes

- 30-year closed amortization period with a funding target of 90% by the end of 2040 (currently expires in 2033 with a funding target of 100%)
- expanded investment authority including corporate bonds for all funds and greater equity investments for funds with assets of at least \$10 million; and
- 5-year smoothing of actuarial gains and losses.

For Barrington, these changes should have a positive impact on the Village's contribution to its pension funds. Our Village has always been committed to its public safety employees and has demonstrated that commitment by traditionally funding more than 100% of its pension obligations, as demonstrated in the following chart:

Even in the most challenging years for the Village, 2008 and 2009, the Village contributed more than 100% of its required contribution to its pension funds. The challenge facing the Village, then and now, is the magnitude of the cost increases for pension funding which threaten the Village's ability to continue providing services with its current revenue base. As an example, the Village's required contribution in 2009 for the Police Pension Fund was \$381,751, for 2011 this increased to \$640,467, a 67.77% increase in two years despite the Village contributing an average of 13.5% more than required in the last four years.

Public Safety pension benefit levels are set by the Illinois State Legislature but the Village is required by Illinois Statute to fund the benefits regardless of the impact on the Village's services. The Village's annual contribution is actuarially calculated based on current pension fund assets, projected investment returns, and future pension benefit payments. The Village Board and I have been strong advocates of public safety pension reform since 2007 because we recognized that future pension costs would be unsustainable. We believe this legislation is a good first step but that additional reforms are necessary to make the pension systems sustainable and affordable for communities.

## Holiday Light Recycling Program



The Barrington Public Works Department has established a "Holiday Light Recycling Program". Collection of these lights will be at the Public Works Facility, 300 N. Raymond Ave, beginning January 1st, through March 1st, 2011, Monday through Friday 8:00am to 2:00pm. The drop off bin will be located at the main entrance of Public Works.

Accepted for recycling will be: mini-lights (or Italian lights), C7 lights, C9 lights, rope lights, LED lights, extension cords. All colors and lengths will be accepted. ## Village Installs New Fareboxes

You may have noticed the new Commuter Parking Fareboxes. The new fareboxes were put into use on November 16, 2010, at which time the old "smart cards" were no longer operational. The North Commuter Parking Lot provides general parking on a first-come, first-parked basis. The charge for the lot is \$3.00 per day (effective February 1, 2009) and commuters can pay with cash or credit card (Visa, Mastercard, American Express, and Discover) at all payment stations. ## Drug Prevention Panel Discussion - February 3

An important community program will be held at 7 pm on Thursday, February 3rd in the Barrington High School Auditorium. The Barrington Area Drug Prevention Coalition is sponsoring a panel discussion addressing underage drinking in Barrington entitled, *Strong Parents=Strong Youth*.

The Illinois Youth Survey results from Barrington middle and high schools will be presented by Dr. Tom Leonard, Superintendent CUSD 220. Laws related to hosting illegal parties for youth will be discussed by the Honorable Christopher Stride and Police Chief Jerry Libit. The impact of underage drinking on brain development and general health will be reviewed by Dr. William Watson from Advocate Condell Medical Center and Dr. Heather Hale from the Family Development Center will discuss underage drinking and mental health issues. ## Get Real-Time, Customized Traffic Info Delivered to Your Email

What if you could know about a traffic accident, construction, or other kind of incident before you started driving, so you could take a different route? You can, and have it sent right to your email! The new Lake County PASSAGE Email Notification program allows users to sign up for real-time traffic alerts for designated roadways throughout Lake County.



All you have to do is go to [www.lakecountypassage.com](http://www.lakecountypassage.com) and click on Email Notifications. You can create your own personal profile (i.e.: work commute), create regions that encompass the roads where you will travel, and choose when you want to receive notifications. Users can adjust notifications for different times and days per profile, and choose to receive alerts for different types of events including roadwork, unusual congestion, and incidents such as stalls, crashes, debris, traffic signal malfunctions as well as county-wide special alerts. Also, users can create up to 15 customizable regions per profile and multiple profiles for different travel patterns.

The email notification is another feature of Lake County PASSAGE, which also includes real-time traffic information on [www.lakecountypassage.com](http://www.lakecountypassage.com), 1620 AM, LCTV, and variable message signs along roadways.

## Winter Parking November 1<sup>st</sup> through March 31<sup>st</sup>



To allow snow plows to safely maneuver and clean the streets for emergency response vehicles, parking is not permitted after 1:00 a.m. on streets within the Central Business District when snow accumulation is over two inches, until snow removal operations are complete. Parking is not permitted at any time on residential streets outside of the Central Business District when snow accumulation is two inches or more, until snow removal operations are complete.

Just as a reminder, parking is always prohibited on all Village Streets between the hours of 1:00 A.M. until 6:00 A.M. Village snow removal crews typically complete post storm clean-up of Village streets during the hours of 1:00 A.M. and 6:00 A.M. after the storm has ended. Please refrain from parking on the street until after all snow and ice control efforts have been completed.
