Heinen's Fine Foods, a grocery company, announced it has chosen the Village of Barrington to be the location of its first store in Illinois and will open in the summer of 2012. After providing quality groceries for over 82 years in North-eastern Ohio, Heinen's has set its sights on bringing this special grocery experience to the Barrington area.

Heinen's is known for its superior customer service; its distinctive quality product offerings, including premium meats which are raised to strict specifications; one day dock-to-store seafood; locally sourced fresh produce; a large selection of chef-prepared foods and an extensive selection of fine wines, craft beers and artisan cheeses.



The third generation family-owned and operated grocery store chain chose Barrington as its first out-of-state location because of its reputation as a "great place to live, work and play."

Peggy Blanchard, Barrington's Director of Economic and Community Development, visited Heinen's in 2007. Heinen's will also have a positive impact on job growth with new employment opportunities available for area residents. We look forward to the store opening in the summer of 2012."



Construction will begin in the next few months at 500 North Hough Street at The Shops at Flint Creek. Heinen's anticipates hiring approximately 80 associates for the village store.

"We are looking forward to serving the people in and around the Village of Barrington," said Jeff Heinen. "We are a community focused company and plan to bring the same dedication and commitment to excellence that

Charity Begins at Home

Barrington, Illinois is home to, literally, hundreds of charitable organizations, which annually raise and give back millions of dollars, innumerable necessities, and many hours of time to our community and far beyond. As we are in the midst of the Fall fundraising season, it is a great time to offer a huge thank you to all who support and manage these charitable organizations with their time, talent and treasure.

Our charities support individual and family day-to-day needs, the environment, education, victims of abuse, senior needs, those in need of counseling or help with career services, those in physical pain, and those facing the end of life – just to name a few of the many needs addressed. To attempt to name each organization and the folks who keep them going is not the intent of this column. I hope each and every one of them hear our collective appreciation in this letter and far more often than that.

I would, however, like to give a special mention to three local charities which are new or newly expanded in the past year.

Teens for Teens was established a few years ago by about 15 Barrington Middle School students to encourage service by teens which would aid other teens, particularly in under-served areas. In recent times, the charity has expanded to involve about 200 eighth grade students who, with their adult assistants, inculcate and exemplify a culture of service through projects and fundraising, which benefit other teens. This past year, funds were awarded as scholarship money to college bound high schoolers in the Lawndale area of Chicago to cover some necessary, but unmet, college expenses.

Barrington Children's Charities was started in the last year by local families dedicated to supporting the needs of children in the greater Barrington area. The venture is off to a wonderful start and has garnered growing support for the help it will provide to the youngest members of our community.

Impact 100 Chicago, also completing its first year, was the brainchild, or shall I say "heartchild", of some Barrington women seeking to maximize the amount contributed to one (or a very small number of) worthy causes in any given year. If 100 women could donate and all of that money could go to one charity - what an impact that could make in Chicagoland. Happily, the group surpassed its initial goal and was able to support more than one charity in the greater Chicago region in 2011.

Even in these difficult economic times, and in many respects, because of them, area residents decided to look beyond themselves and join the ranks of those in the Barrington charity fold. These folks, like the others, believe in giving back and thus established or expanded these three charities. We often say that Barrington is a great place to live, work and play. Its charitable heart is an essential part of that greatness.



The Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) is arranging for a document destruction company to be in the North Commuter Parking Lot at Main and Wool Streets in Barrington on October 22, 2011 from 9:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m., rain or shine. Free of charge, Barrington residents (with proof of residency) can bring

items such as bank statements, medical forms, personal files, and retired tax forms, to be safely shredded. Staples and paper clips do not need to be removed, but please remove binders.

Also, to assist residents with collecting old electronics and to ensure environmentally-safe recycling of these materials, SWANCC will also be accepting electronics such as, computers, monitors, DVD players, DVRs, fax machines, printers, scanners, etc. For a complete list of acceptable materials, visit www.swancc.org.


Leaf Season

In order to be more environmentally friendly, Public Works will not be delivering leaf bags to your home. Instead, we are asking that you consider mulching or composting your leaves. Being "Green" will help to reduce the energy expended for transportation, processing and disposal. If you have leaves that cannot be mulched or composted, you may utilize your "Green Monster" or purchase leaf bags at Public Works, Village Hall, the Public Safety Building or locally at Jewel and Walgreens. Please do not rake or blow your leaves on to the street as this can create safety issues and clog storm drains and pipes.



Safety Tips for a HAPPY HALLOWEEN

Halloween is a cherished tradition but the excitement of the night can cause children to forget to be careful. Please review the safety tips below and share them with your child to ensure a safe Halloween.



- Use face paint instead of masks to ensure your children can see well, and provide them with lights or reflective tape to ensure that they can be seen by others.
- Instruct your children to approach only those homes that are well-lit and never to enter a stranger's home.
- Instruct your children to eat nothing until they come home and the treats have been inspected by you.
- Instruct your children to travel only in familiar areas and along an established route.
- Do not light your pumpkin with a candle; instead use a flashlight or cold chemical light-stick.
- Autumn leaves, dry corn stalks, berry branches, similar fall decorations, and even some Halloween costumes can be hazardous. Keep lighted bulbs, open fires, and even adult smoking materials at a safe distance.

Notify the police department of any unusual occurrences or incidents. Call 911 in an emergency.
