## Village Report

### Village Board Approves Referendum Question for Electrical Aggregation

March 20, 2012

At the December 12, 2011 Board meeting the Barrington Village Board voted to approve an ordinance to place a referendum question regarding electrical aggregation on the March 20, 2012 General Election ballot. Voters within the corporate limits of Barrington will see the following question on the ballot:

Shall the Village of Barrington have the authority to arrange for the supply of electricity for its residential and small commercial retail customers who have not opted out of such program?

Recent changes in legislation relative to the deregulation of electricity has resulted in municipal aggregation as a way in which municipalities can pool or aggregate together the electrical supply load of its residents and small businesses. If the referendum question is approved, the Village will be in a position to seek competitive price bids on the electrical supply load for all of the residents and small businesses. The electric supply price for a larger, aggregated load typically results in favorable electric rates.

Approximately 19 communities have already gone through the aggregation process and those communities have received an electric supply price that is lower than the current price offered through Commonwealth Edison. By approving the ordinance to place the question on the March 20, 2012 ballot, Barrington joins numerous other communities that will also have a similar question on their ballots.

### E-Waste/ Electronics Recycling

Beginning January 1, 2012, the Illinois Electronics Products Recycling and Reuse Act (SB2313) landfill ban for certain electronic devices took effect. Electronic items such as televisions, monitors, computers and printers are some of the most common items that will no longer be allowed in the regular trash.



The Village of Barrington is a member of the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) and the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO). Both organizations offer electronics recycling for Village residents. Residents of each county should direct prohibited electronic items to a residential recycling collection event hosted by either SWANCC or SWALCO. SWANCC also offers several permanent drop-off locations, and also hosts one day drop off events throughout the year for its members. Check SWANCC's E-Waste site for locations and times.



- Disaster Response Preparedness
- Fire Suppression Techniques
- Disaster Simulation Drill
- Disaster Medical Operations
- Light Search and Rescue

## Barrington Is A Great Place to Live, Work and Play

Our goal for Barrington is to create an environment where our residents and businesses are part of an active, social and vibrant community. 2011 closed with Barrington adding 34 new businesses to the community and the opportunity to see more economic development continue in 2012. The highlight will be the opening of Heinen's Fine Foods, as it opens its first Chicago area store at Shops at Flint Creek in the summer of 2012. This is a major accomplishment for Barrington, as it will not only fill a vacancy, but add vibrancy to this shopping center. In addition, the community will have 80 to 120 jobs available for our area residents. Secondly, the Village is moving forward with the redevelopment of the Hough-Main site. The Village is completing work on an agreement with the preferred developer to redevelop the site. The anticipated project will be a mixed use retail and office complex that is designed to fit into the overall character of the Village. Work will begin this summer on the replacement of the water main that services the area, which is one of our oldest mains in the Village. Based on the pre-leasing activity and interest in the site, the earliest the developer would commence construction is the fall of 2012 or early 2013. This development will begin to shape the Village Center with new retail and restaurant facilities.

The Village will again have a number of special activities for everyone to enjoy with their family and friends. The Barrington Art Festival will return this Memorial Day Weekend, followed by Cruise Nights to be held every Thursday beginning in June through Labor Day, Farmers Market and the 4th of July activities. There will be a lot to do in Barrington throughout 2012. I invite you to shop and dine locally, and enjoy all the activities available that make Barrington a social, active and vibrant community.

## Winter Parking

November 1<sup>st</sup> through March 31<sup>st</sup>



To allow snow plows to safely maneuver and clean the streets for emergency response vehicles, parking is not permitted after 1:00 a.m. on streets within the Central Business District when snow accumulation is over two inches, until snow removal operations are complete. Parking is not permitted at any time on residential streets outside of the Central Business District when snow accumulation is two

inches or more, until snow removal operations are complete. Just as a reminder, parking is always prohibited on all Village Streets between the hours of 1:00 A.M. until 6:00 A.M. Village snow removal crews typically complete post storm clean-up of Village streets during the hours of 1:00 A.M. and 6:00 A.M. after the storm has ended. Please refrain from parking on the street until after all snow and ice control efforts have been completed.

## Snow Removal Tips

During snow storms, watch Channel 4 and the Village's website [www.barrington-il.gov](http://www.barrington-il.gov) for detailed snow removal tips. Like most municipalities in northern Illinois, the Village requires residents and business owners to clear snow and ice from the sidewalks adjacent to your property. Keeping your sidewalk clear is important for preventing hazardous conditions for pedestrians. Please remember to do your part to help assure the safety of your neighborhoods and customers by making sure your sidewalk is promptly cleared.

### Snow Piled at End of Driveways

Because there are more than 3,800 driveways in the Village, we do not have enough equipment and personnel to clear snow at the end of driveways. We recommend waiting until the street has been plowed from curb to curb before clearing your driveway.
