Hough-Main Project

Since the early 1990's, the Village Board(s) of Barrington have worked to revitalize and reinvigorate our Village Center. Developing a downtown Master Plan, calling for a pedestrian friendly center with a critical mass of retail, was a key part of that strategy. Establishment of a TIF district for the downtown in 2000, refreshing the streetscape, offering funds for façade improvement and business rehabilitation, and supporting the creation of the Cook Street Plaza project, were all critical next steps. Now, in 2012, we are witnessing the unfolding of another phase of this reinvigoration.

We are pleased to announce that redevelopment is moving forward on the site located at the southwest corner of Hough and Main Street. The Village has approved a redevelopment agreement with the team of Arthur Hill & Co. LLC and Envision Realty Advisors, LLC. This team has a combined 100+ years of development, leasing and management skills that will be applied to the "Barrington Village Center" project. This project will bring added value to our community by providing additional retail, restaurant and office venues, which will further support our existing business community.

The conceptual plan for the development contains two buildings to be characterized by well designed architecture to house a unique mix of retail, restaurants and office use in an unparalleled location in the heart of our community. This project will include the vacant property that fronts on Hough Street, Main Street and Station Street, excluding the MJ Miller property. The total project size will consist of 25,000 square feet of retail and 30,000 square feet of office. Depending on leasing activity, there could be a third story added for office space.

The approval of the redevelopment agreement and ground lease are just the first steps in the redevelopment process. This summer the developer will begin the process to obtain planned development special use approval for the project. This will include presentation of more detailed plans for the project and public hearings on the plans before the Plan Commission. These hearings will give all the opportunity to provide input into the final project. We anticipate that the process will begin in late summer.

Residents will begin to see construction activity on the site late this summer as the Village initiates a project to install a new water main on Main Street. The Village has delayed this project waiting for the Hough Main area to redevelop. The new water service will have a benefit not only for this project but for other businesses in the Village Center.

We are excited to have as our partner on the Hough-Main project, an experienced and thoughtful developer. We believe that in working with this team, through a process that assures public input, that the best development possible for our Village will be delivered.

Village News You Can Use

Overnight Parking on Village Streets is Prohibited

Overnight parking on Village streets is prohibited from 1:00 AM to 6:00 AM. Restricting parking then helps the Police Department reduce traffic hazards, and identify suspicious vehicles or situations. It also helps the Public Works Department complete snow removal operations in the winter, and the rest of the year it helps with street cleaning in the Center Business District and regular maintenance.

Overnight parking is prohibited in Village maintained parking lots from 2:00 AM to 5:00 AM for the same reasons. Those later times have now been extended to certain streets in the Center Business District as well. The later parking allowance applies to Park Avenue from Main Street to Grove Avenue; Station Street from Grove Avenue to Hough Street; Cook Street from Main Street to Lake Street; Wool Street from Main Street to Klingenberg Parkway and Klingenberg Parkway from Wool Street to Route 14.

On a limited basis residents and visitors can get approval to park on the street overnight by calling the Police Department at 847-304-3300 before the restricted hours begin. Overnight parking in Village commuter parking lots is also available on a limited basis for up to 3 consecutive nights at \$10 per night. Payment for parking in Village commuter parking lots should be done beforehand at the Village Hall or Police Department. Payment for overnight parking in the north commuter parking lots can also be done online at www.parkmobile.com.

West Main Street CN Railroad Crossing Improvement Project

The Canadian National Railroad (CN) is scheduled to commence railroad crossing improvements on West Main Street at Raymond Avenue the week of June 11, 2012. The crossing improvements will require a temporary full closure of the crossing to both pedestrians and vehicle traffic, for five (5) to six (6) days. The Illinois Department of Transportation and CN will establish a temporary detour during this time. The CN and the Village apologize for any inconvenience this project may cause, but the improvements at this crossing are long overdue. If you have any questions regarding this improvement, please contact the Public Works Department at (847) 381-7903.

Dog Tags are Due July 1st

These tags are only \$5 and can mean the difference between losing your dog and the Police Department returning your dog safely to you. These dog tags are available at the Village Hall or online at www.barrington-il.gov, and are effective from July 1st through June 30th. If a dog is found without a Village or County tag, its owner can be charged a minimum of \$10 for the first offense. If you have any questions, please call (847) 304-3400.

Utility Companies Offer New Resources to Residents

This time last year, Illinois experienced several severe storms that caused power outages for long stretches of time. Since then, ComEd has created an outage alert program that allows residents to report outages via text message. Subscribers to the system can simply text the word "OUT" to 26633 (COMED) to report an outage at the



location ComEd has associated with their cell phone number. Once notified, ComEd will provide regular updates on the status of their outage until service is restored. In order to subscribe, customers will need either the ComEd account number, the account holder's social security number or the primary phone number on the account. 

Barrington Junior Women’s Club Offers Community Support

Character Counts! (CC!) has been adopted by Barrington Junior Women’s Club (BJWC) in the Barrington area. CC! is a national awards program to advocate core ethical values through the “Six Pillars of Character” - namely Trustworthiness, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness, Caring and Citizenship. Since 2001, these awards have been offered to people who are not usually in the limelight, most often someone who may never have received an award before. Their character may be exemplified in a unique act of kindness, or a track record of fairness, responsibility, etc. CC! Awards will be presented at a Village Board meeting on June 11, 2012. CC! awards are given to a cross-section of community members; including but not limited to students, coaches, employees of local businesses, community volunteers, and neighbors. If the nominee is a child, the act must be independent of adult prompting.

Kids On The Block (KOTB) is an educational puppet program performed by members of BJWC designed to enrich the study of and promote acceptance of differences and social issues. This puppet program is an effective tool in teaching third and fourth grade students in the Barrington community school district. Students respond enthusiastically to the puppets as they dramatize the problems associated with being “different”. Puppet presentations are available to address such issues as bullying, autism, asthma, diabetes, divorce and ADHD.
