
Farmer's Market



Explanation of Financial Reporting

In June of each year the Village issues its Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for the preceding year. The CAFR includes multiple financial statements that together present the financial results of operations for the Village for the fiscal year. The issuance of the CAFR is the end result of the audit process, which takes about five months (January to May) to complete.

Illinois Statute requires the Village to issue financial statements that conform to Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) within six months after the end of each fiscal year. The financial statements must be audited by a firm of licensed, certified public accountants who perform their audit in accordance with Generally Accepted Auditing Standards (GAAS).

GAAS requires an audit firm to conduct a study of the internal controls and financial processes of the audit client so that proper testing of those controls and processes can be completed. At the beginning of the audit contract with the Village, the Village's audit firm conducted a comprehensive study of the Village's internal controls and financial processes. Each year, at the beginning of the audit process, Village Staff is asked about any changes in controls or processes so that the audit firm's understanding of the Village's financial system can be updated. The internal controls and processes are then comprehensively tested as the audit firm reviews invoices, payroll records, utility billing records, cash receipt batches, bank reconciliations, and journal entries. The audit firm reviews these records for any errors or evidence that Village Staff has not complied with Village internal controls.

If the audit firm identifies an issue with the Village's compliance with internal controls or processes, a management letter is issued that details the deficiencies or concerns. In 2012, no management letter was issued because no concerns or deficiencies were identified by the auditors. In addition, if the audit firm were to find a material misstatement in the financial statements, they would issue the Village a qualified audit opinion which would indicate that the financial statements could not be relied upon. The Village has never received an adverse audit opinion on its financial statements.

In addition to the audit, the Village also submits its CAFR to the Government Finance Officer's Association (GFOA) for a further review by three anonymous municipal finance professionals. The GFOA reviews the Village's financial statements to ensure they conform to the highest standards of financial reporting. At the end of the review, if the document is found to meet these standards, the document receives the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting. The Village has received this award for 28 consecutive years.

The Village's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2012 will be reviewed with the Board of Trustees on June 10th, 2013 and assuming the Board is satisfied with the document, the CAFR will be officially accepted that same evening and posted to the Village's website on June 11th, 2013.



Overnight Parking on Village Streets is Prohibited

Overnight parking on Village streets is prohibited from 1:00 AM to 6:00 AM. Restricting parking helps the Police Department reduce traffic hazards, and identify suspicious vehicles or situations. It also helps the Public Works Department complete snow removal operations in the winter, and the rest of the year it helps with street cleaning and regular maintenance in the Center Business District.

Overnight parking is prohibited in Village maintained parking lots from 2:00 AM to 5:00 AM for the same reasons. Those later times have now been extended to certain streets in the Center Business District as well. The later parking allowance applies to Park Avenue from Main Street to Grove Avenue; Station Street from Grove Avenue to Hough Street; Cook Street from Main Street to Lake Street; Wool Street from Main Street to Klingenberg Parkway and Klingenberg Parkway from Wool Street to Route 14.

On a limited basis, residents and visitors can get approval to park on the street overnight by calling the Police Department at 847-304-3300 before the restricted hours begin. Overnight parking in Village commuter parking lots is also available on a limited basis for up to 3 consecutive nights at \$10 per night. Payment for parking in Village commuter parking lots should be done beforehand at the Village Hall or Police Department. Payment for overnight parking in the north commuter parking lots can also be done online at www.parkmobile.com (Zone 162).

Dog Tags are Due July 1st

These tags are only \$5 and can mean the difference between losing your dog and the Police Department returning your dog safely to you. These dog tags are available at the Village Hall or online at www.barrington-il.gov and are effective from July 1st through June 30th. If a dog is found without a Village or County tag, its owner can be charged a minimum of \$10 for the first offense. If you have any questions, please call (847) 304-3400.
