## Village Hosts Open House for Barrington's White House

*Barrington's White House. You may know it as the white house across the street from the Jewel. For many years it was the home of Barrington Realty; before that a rest home, a makeshift hospital during the influenza outbreak of 1918, and originally a private residence.*

*Built for John and Julia Robertson in 1898 by Fred Lines, it was considered the grandest house in Barrington. John Robertson was a successful area banker and Julia a charming and popular hostess. The couple hosted many events in the beautiful third floor ballroom, and the home was considered the social center of Barrington.*

*The Village purchased the house from Barrington Realty in 2007 as part of the downtown revitalization efforts. The Village always hoped to find a re-use for the building that would also preserve its history. Over the last few years, the Village has been evaluating various uses for the building that would allow it to be self sustaining, and create a purpose that would enrich and benefit the community.*

*Last year we began working with a firm that specializes in historic structures, Johnson Lasky Architects (JLA). JLA, along with Pepper Construction, have been assessing how to best restore and renovate the building and bring it into compliance with current codes and accessibility needs. Harold Rider, an area resident with expertise in historic real estate and special events, has also been an invaluable resource.*

*The vision of the Village is to renovate the property into an elegant and highly functional cultural and community center, physically accessible to all visitors. The first floor will retain its original configuration of rooms, with a full catering kitchen. The second floor will be primarily rental office spaces for non-profit organizations, as well as a bride's room. The third floor will be completely remodeled. The remodel will expand the ballroom, originally occupying the front of the house to the entire length of the house and will be able to accommodate seated parties of 150.*

*Barrington's White House Campaign is being led by a volunteer committee of Mary Smith, Tom Hayward, Dave Nelson, Freddie Smith Pederson, Beth Raseman, and myself. The Committee will be working to raise funds to support the restoration of Barrington's landmark on Main Street. We would love to have the renovation completed during the Sesquicentennial year.*

*We want everyone to come and see the possibilities this house offers. The house will be open for public viewing on Saturday, November 16 from 10-3 and Sunday, November 17 from 12-3.*

## Safety First

Decorative lights should never be used on metallic trees. Candles should never be used on trees. Use only flame-retardant or non-combustible decorations. Keep presents and gifts away from lighting. Be sure that the gifts themselves are fire-safe. Do not use indoor lights outdoors. All outdoor lights should be weatherproofed. Install and maintain smoke alarms.



## Winter Garbage Requests

During the winter months, garbage pickup is more difficult due to snow and ice conditions. The Village respectfully requests that residents place all garbage and recycling containers on the driveway or parkway adjacent to the street. Do not place the containers on the street, as this can create a hazardous condition for snow plowers and residents. Thank you for your consideration.

## Barrington Fire Department Update

*As you probably are aware, come January 1st, the Village of Barrington Fire Department will have a new look. As your reorganized fire department takes shape, we thought now would be a good time to update you on our progress to have a fire department that serves Barrington first and foremost. The Village is committed to continuing to provide excellent services to its residents and we are moving forward with this obligation.*

*The parting of ways between the Barrington Fire Department and the District provides us with an opportunity to reorganize our department in a way that delivers even better service while also delivering very real, long-term cost savings. Nothing is more important than the safety of our families, our businesses and our community.*

*As provided in our intergovernmental agreement, the Village and the District recently divided equipment, leaving the Village with two ambulances, one Quint (aerial truck), and one fire engine, to mention a few items. The two ambulances housed in our station for every shift will allow us to be able to respond to our most frequent calls -- emergency medical calls -- in a better way as we will have two staffed ambulances operating out of our station. Previously, just one ambulance worked out of our main station and a second overlapping medical call was responded to from a more distant station.*

*We are currently solidifying automatic and mutual aid agreements with several neighboring public safety agencies. Automatic and mutual aid agreements have served our region well over the years and we know they will continue to do so well into the future. As always, we can depend on our partners for aid when it is needed in Barrington. And, our partners can call on us when they need additional assets and resources.*

*We are grateful for the dedication and commitment Barrington firefighters have delivered to our community over the years. This team of men and women stands ready to serve our community, as they have done day in and day out for decades. ## Train Problems? Don't Just Fume - Take Action

As the CN traffic builds on the EJ&E line, we understand that resident frustrations are building as well. In August, about two-thirds of CN's overall projected traffic ran on the EJ&E. Across the greater Barrington area, we are hearing the complaints loud and clear about travel delays due to blocked crossings; freight running during peak commuter hours and gridlocking the roads; horn and way-side noise at all hours; and idling trains sitting for long hours.

Because we expect this traffic volume to ebb and flow in the months ahead, it's important that you know you have the power to register your complaints to the Surface Transportation Board during the oversight period for this rail merger. Don't waste the opportunity to tell federal regulators how CN operations are impacting the quality of life in our community.

If you are bothered by CN's operations, go to [www.FightRailCongestion.com](http://www.FightRailCongestion.com) and click onto the "Register Rail Complaint" icon on the home page. Add this website to your mobile devices, so the next time you are stalled in traffic watching a mile-long train crawl by and blocking traffic for more than 10 minutes, you can do more than just fume! Whether you are at home or in your car, it's important that the STB hears from us. Otherwise, they will conclude that things are running smoothly.



## Village Vision

## Winter Parking

November 1<sup>st</sup> through March 31<sup>st</sup>



To allow snow plows to safely maneuver and clean the streets for emergency response vehicles, parking is not permitted after 1:00 a.m. on streets within the Central Business District when snow accumulation is over two inches, until snow removal operations are complete. Parking is not permitted at any time on residential streets outside of the Central Business District when snow accumulation is two inches or more, until snow

removal operations are complete. Just as a reminder, parking is always prohibited on all Village Streets between the hours of 1:00 A.M. until 6:00 A.M. Village snow removal crews typically complete post storm clean-up of Village streets during the hours of 1:00 A.M. and 6:00 A.M. after the storm has ended. Please refrain from parking on the street until after all snow and ice control efforts have been completed.

## Snow Removal Tips

During snow storms, watch Channel 4 and the Village's website [www.barrington-il.gov](http://www.barrington-il.gov) for detailed snow removal tips. Like most municipalities in northern Illinois, the Village requires residents and business owners to clear snow and ice from the sidewalks adjacent to your property. Keeping your sidewalk clear is important for preventing hazardous conditions for pedestrians. Please remember to do your part to help assure the safety of your neighborhoods and customers by making sure your sidewalk is promptly cleared.

### Snow Piled at End of Driveways

Because there are more than 3,800 driveways in the Village, we do not have enough equipment and personnel to clear snow at the end of driveways. We recommend waiting until the street has been plowed from curb to curb before clearing your driveway.
