## Barrington's Fire Rating Greatly Improves

Hooray! Barrington is in the Top 1.5% in the Nation!!

The Village was recently notified by the Insurance Services Office (ISO) that the Public Protection Classification for the Village of Barrington will improve from a Class 4 to a Class 2, as of August 1, 2014. This office's ratings are commonly referred to as ISO ratings and they classify U.S. fire departments and fire districts on a scale of 1 – 10 with Class 1 being the best. The ISO classification demonstrates the relationship between excellent fire protection and low fire losses. The classifications are used by insurance companies to help determine rates for property within the jurisdiction. The better the classification the better the insurance rate.

Throughout the United States only 1.5% of fire departments are a Class 2 or better. Because of the reorganization of the Barrington Fire Department, which was effective January 1, 2014, the Village's Fire Department was reevaluated and provided with an ISO Class 2 rating, which of course, represents an improvement of 2 classifications over the Class 4 rating it previously held.

Commercial insurance rates could be reduced by the better classification. After August 1st, when the new classification goes into effect, commercial property owners should contact their insurance agents to see if a better rate can be applied to their building, as this new rating is most likely to affect commercial rates. Residential single family homes will continue to receive the lower insurance rates that they have in the past.

While all in the Village should be pleased with this accomplishment, we extend special congratulations to Fire Chief Jim Arie and all of our Barrington Fire Department members for achieving this significant milestone.

## News You Can Use

### Cross Connection Control

As you may already know, the Village of Barrington has elected to move forward with an eco-friendly online cross connection control (backflow preventer) tracking program. The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) requires every water supplier to develop and implement a comprehensive cross connection control program for the elimination of existing cross connections and prevention or protection from all future cross connections.

Cross connections are sometimes protected by a valve called a backflow preventer. Backflow preventers are the property of the water customer and the responsibility lies with the customer for required annual testing and maintenance. The water customer must contract with a licensed tester to perform the required annual tests and any necessary repairs. Most plumbing contractors are now certified to test backflow preventers. There are costs associated with testing and maintaining backflow preventers.

Backflow preventers may be found at any number of locations on your water systems. Typically, commercial & industrial customers will have backflow preventers just after the water meter and also on wet fire protection systems. They may also have lawn irrigation systems or other water connections throughout their facilities that require backflow protection.

Residential backflow preventers may be found on lawn irrigation systems, wet fire protection systems, hot water heating (boiler) systems, swimming pool fills, water features, etc. Backflow preventers may also be required if there is another water source on the site such as a well, pond, river, etc.

Note that lawn sprinkler systems will be starting up soon. Plumbing Code requires that your backflow preventer be tested when the backflow preventer is re-installed every season.

The contractor hired to implement and oversee Barrington's backflow program is Aqua Backflow. They specialize in cross connection control program implementation and management. If you have or require backflow protection, you may be notified for compliance (testing, repairs, installations, inspections, or surveys) by Aqua Backflow. The Barrington Cross Connection Control Program is designed to safeguard public health. We ask for your cooperation with our program, its enforcement, and any requests for information that come from Aqua Backflow or Utility staff.

### Storm Management Help: Lawn Care

Excess fertilizers and pesticides applied to lawns and gardens wash off and pollute streams. In addition, yard clippings and leaves can wash into storm drains and contribute nutrients and organic matter to streams.

- Don't over water your lawn. Consider using a soaker hose instead of a sprinkler.
- Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly. When use is necessary, use these chemicals in the recommended amounts. Use organic mulch or safer pest control methods whenever possible.
- Compost or mulch yard waste. Don't leave it in the street or sweep it into storm drains or streams.
- Cover piles of dirt or mulch being used in landscaping projects.

## Explanation of Financial Reporting

In June of each year the Village issues its Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for the preceding year. The CAFR includes multiple financial statements that together present the financial results of operations for the Village for the fiscal year. The issuance of the CAFR is the end result of the audit process, which takes about five months (January to May) to complete.

Illinois Statute requires the Village to issue financial statements that conform to Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) within six months after the end of each fiscal year. The financial statements must be audited by a firm of licensed, certified public accountants who perform their audit in accordance with Generally Accepted Auditing Standards (GAAS).

GAAS requires an audit firm to conduct a study of the internal controls and financial processes of the audit client so that proper testing of those controls and processes can be completed. At the beginning of the audit contract with the Village, the Village's audit firm conducted a comprehensive study of the Village's internal controls and financial processes. Then, at the beginning of each audit process, Village Staff is asked about any changes in controls or processes so that the audit firm's understanding of the Village's financial system can be updated. The internal controls and processes are then comprehensively tested as the audit firm reviews invoices, payroll records, utility billing records, cash receipt batches, bank reconciliations, and journal entries. The audit firm reviews these records for any errors or evidence that Village Staff has not complied with Village internal controls.

If the audit firm identifies an issue with the Village's compliance with internal controls or processes, a notice of a material weakness in internal control is included in the management letter which details the deficiency or concern. In 2013, the management letter did not include a notice of a material weakness in internal controls as no concerns or deficiencies were identified by the auditors. In addition, if the audit firm were to find a material misstatement in the financial statements, they would issue the Village a qualified audit opinion which would indicate that the financial statements could not be relied upon. The Village has never received an adverse audit opinion on its financial statements.

In addition to the audit, the Village also submits its CAFR to the Government Finance Officer's Association (GFOA) for a further review by three anonymous municipal finance professionals. The GFOA reviews the Village's financial statements to ensure they conform to the highest standards of financial reporting. At the end of the review, if the document is found to meet these standards, the document receives the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting. The Village has received this award for 29 consecutive years.

The Village's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2013 will be reviewed with the Board of Trustees on June 2, 2014 and assuming the Board is satisfied with the document, the CAFR will be officially accepted on June 23, 2014 and posted to the Village's website on June 24, 2014.


