State of the Village: By The Numbers

Public Works

Village Board Meeting Summary

At the Village Board meeting held on February 23rd, the Village Board took action on several items. The following is a summary of some of those items. The complete summary is available on the Village's website at www.barrington-il.gov.

Hiring Part-Time Building Inspector: The Village Board authorized the hiring of a part-time Building Inspector to fill a position vacated by retirement.

Landscape Maintenance Contract: The Village Board authorized a one-year contract to Alaniz Group, Inc. for the purpose of performing maintenance work throughout the Village.

Grit Tank Replacement: The Village Board approved a contract with Huff & Huff, Inc. for the design and construction engineering services related to the replacement of an aerated grit tank used to remove inorganic material from the sewage waste stream.

Garlands Temporary Sign: Pursuant to their planned development ordinance, the Village Board granted an extension to allow the Garlands of Barrington to display their leasing signage until December 31, 2016.

Fleet Software: The Village Board authorized the upgrade of the Fleet Division's computerized fleet analysis software, as included in the FY 2015 budget.

Vehicle Purchase: The Village Board authorized the purchase of a utility truck for the Public Works Department, as included in the FY 2015 budget.

Special 2015 Edition of Quintessential Barrington: The Village Board amended a contract with QMG to produce and distribute a Sesqui-centennial Edition of QB Magazine.

Barrington's White House Landscaping: The Village Board approved a contract with Doering Landscape Co. to install landscaping for BWH. Doering is making a significant donation of materials as part of this contract.

ComEd Green Region Grant Program: The Village Board approved the submission of a grant requesting funding for the landscape restoration and repurposing of the grounds at Barrington's White House.

Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA): The Village Board approved an update to the ADA Transition Plan. The ADA requires municipalities to maintain a plan identifying barriers to access and provide a list of intended remedies.

Village News You Can Use

Fire Hydrant Flushing Scheduled April 12 - April 24 (10:30 p.m. - 7:00 a.m.)

This includes the Village of Barrington, Paganica of Barrington Hills, and Braymore, Weatherstone, Glencrest, and Sanctuary of Inverness

April 27 - 29 (7:00 a.m. - 3:30 p.m.)

This includes Abbey Woods and Estates of Inverness Ridge

The Village conducts an annual flushing of the water distribution system to eliminate as much mineral content as possible from the domestic water supply. Fire hydrant flushing removes a considerable amount of loose mineral content and “settleable” solids that accumulate in the water supply system over a period of time. Fire hydrant flushing operations will be completed from April 12 through April 29 (as listed above, weather permitting). Customers may experience discoloration, low water pressure, and rusty water during flushing operations. These symptoms may occur the entire flushing period, even when flushing may not be in your immediate area. Although water may be discolored, it is safe to drink; however, until the water runs clear, it is advisable to avoid washing clothes, especially white fabrics. Barrington Named “Tree City USA”



Barrington is proud to be named a “Tree City USA” for the 28th consecutive year. The Tree City USA program, sponsored by the Arbor Day Foundation in cooperation with the USDA Forest Service and the National Association of State Foresters, provides direction, technical assistance, public attention, and national recognition for urban and community forestry programs in thousands of towns and cities that more than 135 million Americans call home. The many benefits of being a Tree City include creating a framework for action, education, a positive public image, and citizen pride.

Arbor Day Celebration - Friday April 24

In celebration of Arbor Day on Friday, April 24, Commonwealth Edison will donate trees to be planted at area grade schools. The Public Works Department is providing tree saplings to be distributed to all 4th grade students as part of the celebration. The Council of Garden Clubs will give a presentation to students, where they will learn how trees produce food and energy for people and wildlife, how properly selected and planted trees conserve energy, and much more.

Spring Chipper Schedule

Monday, May 4 - North of Main Street

Monday, May 11 - South of Main Street

Please have all the material out to the curb by 7:00 a.m. on your designated Monday morning. The Chipper will make only ONE pass through your neighborhood. Branches may be up to 10” in diameter and at least 4’ in length. Stack branches neatly in a long low pile on the parkway, with the cut end facing the curb. Public Works crews cannot pick up material on private property. The following items cannot be picked up: root balls & stumps; building materials; anything with nails, wire or bolts; any materials placed in a box or garbage can; grass; leaves; or any materials other than wooded branch materials. Remember to utilize your Groot yard waste tote throughout the season.

Bike to School Day - May 6, 2015

Spring has arrived after a long winter and we have much to look forward to.

Bike to School Day is right around the corner! National Bike to School Day began in 2012 and Barrington has been a proud participant for the past 2 years. National Bike to School Day not only encourages children to ride their bikes to school, but learn about bike safety and promote a healthy lifestyle. This year Bike to School Day falls on Wednesday, May 6, 2015. This is a great way to kick start National Bike Month!

As we approach another bike riding season, here are a few bicycle safety and maintenance tips to help make bicycling more fun!

Just like driving a car, there are rules for riding your bike:

- Ride on the right side of the road or trail, because drivers expect, and look for, other traffic on the right.
- Obey traffic laws—signs and signals, including stoplights.
- Look back before turning or moving left.
- Ride single file if there are cars behind you.
- Use hand signals to let drivers know what you are going to do.
- Be careful of people walking — warn them you are coming.
- Look out for cars backing up — They may not see you.
- Don’t ride too close to parked cars.
- Feel unsafe? You can always walk your bike.

Properly maintaining your bicycle is vital to riding safely. Check it yourself before each ride with the ABC Quick Check:

AIR — pinch the tires, they should be hard, with good air pressure.

BRAKES — make sure they work and aren’t rubbing the tire.

CRANK/CHAIN — if there are problems with your gears or if the chain is loose, take it to a bike shop for repairs

QUICK — check “quick release levers” and other bolts to make sure they are tight.

Finally, your helmet should be worn the right way:

First, put on your helmet so it is level and snug — if it slides around, you need thicker pads.

EYES — you should see the very edge of your helmet when you look up past your eyebrow.

EARS — the straps should meet right under your ear to form a Y.

MOUTH — the strap should be loose enough so you can breathe and insert one or two fingers between the buckle and your skin, but tight enough that if you drop your jaw, you can feel the helmet pull down the top of your head.

Train Problems? Don't Just Fume - Take Action

As the CN traffic builds on the EJ&E line, we understand that resident frustrations are building as well. In August, about two-thirds of CN's overall projected traffic ran on the EJ&E. Across the greater Barrington area, we are hearing the complaints loud and clear about travel delays due to blocked crossings; freight running during peak commuter hours and gridlocking the roads; horns and way-side noise at all hours; and idling trains sitting for long hours.

Because we expect this traffic volume to ebb and flow in the months ahead, it's important that you know you have the power to register your complaints to the Surface Transportation Board during the oversight period for this rail merger. Don't waste the opportunity to tell federal regulators how CN operations are impacting the quality of life in our community.



If you are bothered by CN's operations, go to www.FightRailCongestion.com and click onto the "Register Rail Complaint" icon on the home page. Add this website to your mobile devices, so the next time you are stalled in traffic watching a mile-long train crawl by and blocking traffic for more than 10 minutes, you can do more than just fume! Whether you are at home or in your car, it's important that the STB hears from us. Otherwise, they will conclude that things are running smoothly.

Know What's Below. Call Before You Dig.



You may be surprised by what's buried in your yard. That's because most electric, gas, water, sewer and telecommunications companies are delivering utility services underground. To avoid personal injury and damage to those underground lines, state law requires you to contact JULIE before any digging project, regardless of the project size or depth. Both the call and JULIE's services are free. You can prevent injury and avoid damage by following these four important steps:

- Call or Click before you dig
- Wait the required amount of time (two working days after your phone call)
- Respect the marks
- Dig with care

Notify JULIE if you are doing any of the following projects: decks and patios, trees or shrubs, swing sets, signs, fountains, tents, fences, mailbox posts, room additions, gardens, swimming pools, landscaping, etc.
