Cross Connection Control (Backflow Preventer)

Aqua Backflow

Protecting your water supply from contamination SM

As you may already know, the Village of Barrington has elected to move forward with an eco-friendly online cross connection control (backflow preventer) tracking program. The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) requires every water supplier to develop and implement a comprehensive cross connection control program for the elimination of existing cross connections and prevention or protection from all future cross connections.

Cross connections are sometimes protected by a valve called a backflow preventer. Backflow preventers are the property of the water customer and the responsibility lies with the customer for required annual testing and maintenance. The water customer must contract with a licensed tester to perform the required annual tests and any necessary repairs. Most plumbing contractors are now certified to test backflow preventers. There are costs associated with testing and maintaining backflow preventers.

Backflow preventers may be found at any number of locations on your water systems. Typically, commercial & industrial customers will have backflow preventers just after the water meter and also on wet fire protection systems. They may also have lawn irrigation systems or other water connections throughout their facilities that require backflow protection.

Residential backflow preventers may be found on lawn irrigation systems, wet fire protection systems, hot water heating (boiler) systems, swimming pool fills, water features, etc. Backflow preventers may also be required if there is another water source on the site such as a well, pond, river, etc.

Note that lawn sprinkler systems will be starting up soon. Plumbing Code requires that your backflow preventer be tested when the backflow preventer is re-installed every season.

The contractor hired to implement and oversee Barrington's backflow program is Aqua Backflow. They specialize in cross connection control program implementation and management. If you have or require backflow protection, you may be notified for compliance (testing, repairs, installations, inspections, or surveys) by Aqua Backflow. The Barrington Cross Connection Control Program is designed to safeguard public health. We ask for your cooperation with our program, its enforcement, and any requests for information that come from Aqua Backflow or Utility staff.

Memorial Day in Barrington

It's May and that means it's time to start into summer mode. Regular outdoor activities and special events like Cruise Nights and the Art Festival get underway by the end of this month. The official start of the summer season is, of course, Memorial Day – and Memorial Day in Barrington is a very special day.

Sometimes it rains or is overcast, but more often it seems Memorial Day is a bright sunny day with a beautiful blue sky over Barrington. One can feel the excitement in the fresh air when approaching the Veterans memorial area at Cook and Main Streets. By 10:00 a.m., people are filling the sidewalks in anticipation of the 10:30 a.m. flag salute and parade. The school band, Boy and Girl Scout troops and veterans of all branches of our military line up in the streets and soon it is time to come to attention. The flag raising and salute at the flag pole are solemn moments marking the beginning of this memorial event and evoking a sense of patriotism deep inside of those assembled.

The parade route down Main Street and up Dundee Avenue to Evergreen Cemetery is lined with moms and dads, teens, toddlers, and grandparents – some holding flags, some dressed in red, white and blue. All attendees respectfully clap for the representatives of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, and Merchant Marine who have served their country in World War II, Korea, Vietnam, the Persian Gulf, Iraq, Afghanistan, and in many other places in between, as they pass by on their way to remember those who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country.


Words cannot adequately convey the feeling in Evergreen Cemetery as the parade surrounds the monument on the hill erected in 1906 "in memory of our heroes of the Civil War." On Memorial Day, the current patriotic Barringtonians stand surrounded, as well, by the stone grave markers of those who stood in Barrington honoring patriotic heroes over 100 years before.

The memorial service conducted by the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign War at the cemetery touches the heart – from the reading of the names of those veterans from Barrington who have passed in the last year, to the beautiful a cappella songs from Barrington choir students, to the recitation of memorial poems like "In Flanders Fields", to the wreath and flower laying at the monument by sincere young scouts, to the rousing 21-gun salute and finally, to the closing notes of "Taps" with its spectral echo.

A sense of honor, respect and patriotism is palpable on Memorial Day in Barrington. This day embodies something that is quintessentially Barrington.

*Fly the American Flag... with
All Due Respect*

Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, is a day of remembrance for those who have died in our nation's service. With Memorial Day approaching and Flag Day set annually as June 14th, many of us are planning to fly our American flags and are concerned about properly displaying and honoring one of our nation's most visible symbols.

The Flag Code, which formalizes and unifies the traditional ways in which we give respect to the flag, also contains specific instructions on how the flag is not to be used. Some of these instructions include:

- The Flag should never be used as apparel, bedding, or drapery.
- When the Flag is lowered, no part of it should touch the ground or any other object; it should be received by waiting hands and arms.
- When displaying a flag outdoors, it should not be displayed on days when the weather is inclement, except when an all-weather flag is displayed.
- The Flag should not be draped over the hood, top, sides, or back of a vehicle, or of a railroad train or a boat. If displayed on a motorcar, the staff should be fixed firmly to the chassis or clamped to the right fender.
- When displayed from a staff in a church or public auditorium, the flag of the United States should hold the position of superior prominence. No other flag or pennant should be placed above it, or if at the same level, it should fly to the right of the U.S. flag.
- The Flag should form a distinctive feature of the ceremony of unveiling a statue or monument, but it should never be used as the covering for the statue or monument.
- On Memorial Day, the Flag should be displayed at half-staff until noon only, and then raised to the top of the staff.
- The Flag should be cleaned and mended when necessary. When it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, it should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferable by burning. Most American Legion Posts regularly conduct a dignified flag burning ceremony. There is a flag drop-off box at Veteran's Park at Park Avenue and Cook Street.

Village Board Meeting Summary

At the Village Board meetings held March 16th and April 13th, the Village Board took action on several items. The following is a summary of some of those items.

Variation at 124 Walton Street: The Village Board accepted a positive recommendation from the Zoning Board of Appeals and authorized a variation that will allow for a decrease in the front yard and interior side yard setbacks to expand an attached garage in order to make it handicap accessible.

Barrington's White House Contracts: The Village Board approved the purchase and installation of several items related to Barrington's White House. The first item was a contract with Solstice Art Source to provide specialized leaded glass window repairs and replacement. The second item was a contract with AVI Systems to provide audio and video systems for the first and third floor functions of Barrington's White House. The third item was a contract for the purchase and installation of carpeting at BWH.

Cable Franchise Code Amendment: The Village Board approved a non-exclusive franchise agreement with Comcast of Illinois to provide cable television service to the Village of Barrington.

Motorwerks Special Use/ Planned Development: The Village Board granted approval for amendments to the Master Sign Plan to incorporate site-wide directional signage.

Village Board Room Cameras: The Village Board authorized the purchase and installation of video camera upgrades from AVI Systems for the Village Board room.

FOP Agreement: The Village Board authorized the approval of a collective bargaining agreement with the IL FOP.

Snow & Ice Removal Contract: The Village Board approved contracts with Acres Group for snow and ice removal services in the Chippendale Subdivision, North Commuter Lot, and the Barrington Village Center.

Station Street Reconstruction: As part of the Barrington Village Center project, Station Street is being reconstructed from the western project limits to Hough Street. The Village Board authorized Chadwick Construction to complete the remaining section of Station Street between the Barrington Village Center project and Dundee Avenue.

Ambulance Repairs: The Village Board granted a purchase order to complete needed ambulance repairs.

Plat of Consolidation on Illinois Avenue: The Village Board authorized a plat of consolidation of two lots on Illinois Avenue for the purpose of allowing a resident to construct a single family residence.

Liquor Code Amendment: The Village Board authorized an amendment to the Village Code in order to allow service of alcohol at Barrington's White House.

Commencement of Terms for Elected Officials: The Village Board amended the Village Code to set the commencement date for elected officials as the first regular Board Meeting in May.

1865 Street Festival: The Village Board authorized a special events permit for the "Celebrate Barrington - 1865 Street Festival."

Both the call and JULIE's services are free. You can prevent injury and avoid damage by following these four important steps:

- Call or Click before you dig
- Wait the required amount of time (two working days after your phone call)
- Respect the marks
- Dig with care

Notify JULIE if you are doing any of the following projects: decks and patios, trees or shrubs, swing sets, signs, fountains, tents, fences, mailbox posts, room additions, gardens, swimming pools, landscaping, etc.
