Scheduled to Open*

We are pleased to announce that Barrington's White House will begin accepting reservations and "holds" for 2016 on June 1st. The 1898 mansion's third floor ballroom can host cocktail receptions for up to 175 guests, and seated receptions for 150 people. As a gift to the future of our community, the stately former Robertson family home, known as Barrington's White House located at 145 W. Main Street, is being repurposed and renovated into an elegant and highly functional community and cultural center. Barrington's White House will not only provide the opportunity for our community to give itself a very special 150th birthday present, but the finished product will embody all that we have held dear in our community for the last century and a half.

Through donations and community support, Beth Raseman has coordinated the effort to renovate and create a community and cultural center that will be self-sustaining while still maintaining its historical significance and beauty. Beth has spent more volunteer hours than can be counted on fundraising, finding in-kind donors, reviewing architectural and landscape plans, negotiating not-for-profit tenant leases for the new offices, suggesting policies and plans for White House operations, and even scheduling cultural events for the completed space. Without Beth's diligence and hard work, the opening of Barrington's White House would never come to fruition. Because of her tireless volunteer work, Beth was named as the Barrington Area Development Council's 41st Citizen of the Year. We are grateful for Beth's time and expertise that is truly making a positive lasting difference in the Village of Barrington.

Village News You Can Use

Coexisting with the Wildlife in Our Community

There have been reports involving coyotes and foxes in the Village. The Village previously hosted an informational meeting regarding living with wildlife. Tim Preuss, Lake County Forest Preserve District, gave a presentation that can be found on the Village's website at www.barrington-il.gov.



There are no known incidents of these animals attacking humans in Illinois. Although these species can be somewhat of a nuisance, they do provide a benefit. Both coyotes and foxes prey on small mammals, such as voles, mice, and rabbits. They also feed on geese eggs, which helps to control the geese population. Although it is safe to live near these wild animals, there are several things you can do for you and your pets' safety:

- Do not feed or attempt to pet coyotes or foxes.
- Keep your trash well contained.
- Use squirrel-proof bird feeders and keep seed off the ground, as much as possible. Bird seed attracts small rodents, which will attract coyotes and foxes.
- When walking your dog, keep them on a leash. Do not leave small pets unattended while they are outside.
- Keep your pets' shots up to date.
- In the unlikely event that a coyote approaches you, do not run. Yell, stand up straight and wave your arms (the goal is to make yourself appear larger), or throw something at the coyote to scare it away.

It is important to recognize that coyotes are a permanent fixture in Illinois' rural, suburban, and urban areas. Seeing a coyote(s) cross a field, backyard, golf course, road, etc. does not necessarily constitute a problem or a dangerous situation for humans or domestic animals. Coyote population reduction (removing some or all of the coyotes in an area) is usually unrealistic and always temporary. Removal of coyotes also requires time, effort and funding. Removal can only be authorized by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) District Wildlife Biologist.

Storm Management Help: Lawn Care

Excess fertilizers and pesticides applied to lawns and gardens wash off and pollute streams. In addition, yard clippings and leaves can wash into storm drains and contribute nutrients and organic matter to streams.

- Don't over water your lawn. Consider using a soaker hose instead of a sprinkler.
- Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly. When use is necessary, use these chemicals in the recommended amounts. Use organic mulch or safer pest control methods whenever possible.
- Compost or mulch yard waste. Don't leave it in the street or sweep it into storm drains or streams.
- Cover piles of dirt or mulch being used in landscaping projects.



Emerald Ash Borer Update

Currently, the Village has removed over 800 ash & other trees; eight (8) times the number of removals the Village normally processes in any one year. Village staff will continue to inspect and tag infested or hazardous trees with orange ribbon around the trunk. Homer Tree Care (HTC) will continue to remove trees throughout the year, as necessary. Stump grinding and restoration is going a bit slower than expected due to the sheer volume of stumps. HTC will continue restoration work throughout the year, returning for follow up work. The replacement process will take place throughout the next several years. When the Village is ready to re-plant in your neighborhood, you will receive a letter at that time. Village Board Meeting Summary

At the Village Board meetings held April 27th and May 11th, the Village Board took action on several items. The following is a summary of some of those items.

Appointments: Rollin Potter was appointed to the Cultural Commission and former Trustee Paul Hunt was appointed as Emergency Management Co-Coordinator. In addition, a director and an alternate director were appointed to the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County's Board of Trustees.

Building Inspector: The Board directed staff to fill the vacant position of one full-time building inspector.

Special Use for Demolition: An ordinance was approved granting a special use planned development to allow the demolition of the building located at 345 W. Main Street. The site will be graded, seeded, and landscaped. No redevelopment of the property is proposed at this time.

Special Use for a Tavern: An ordinance was approved granting a special use for a tavern located at 107 E. Main Street. The proposed business, Alley 59, will serve alcohol but not food and is located at the rear of the existing Roots Reclaimed business.

Special Use for Motor Werks: An ordinance was approved to amend an existing planned development to incorporate site-wide directional signage at Motor Werks.

Village Code Amendments: Several code amendments were approved relating to permit fees, ambulance fees, and parking regulations.

Barrington's White House: Several items were approved relative to Barrington's White House, including not-for-profit leases, purchasing security cameras, hiring two facility managers, appointing members to the Advisory Board, and approving the policies relating to the use and operations of the BWH.

Special Events: Several resolutions were passed authorizing special events, including Mother's Day Run, Memorial Day Parade, Relay for Life, Cruise Nights, and the Art Festival.




