Civil War Re-Enactment Comes to Barrington

September 18-20

The Village of Barrington is celebrating its 150th birthday throughout 2015 with a number of family-friendly events. As part of this celebration, experience living history from 1865, when Union and Confederate Civil War reenactors will bring history to life at Citizens Park. Walk through authentic encampments, see cavalry horses, hear musicians, and talk with the soldiers. The camps will be set up on Friday evening, September 18, and on Saturday, September 19, at 2:00 p.m., the infantry will re-enact a battle complete with artillery, cannons, and lots of action. The day will also feature an Abe Lincoln impersonator.



Also on Saturday, September 19, at 10:30 a.m. at the Barrington Area Library, Guy Fraker, an expert on Lincoln's life and times, will give an enlightening presentation. On Sunday, September 20 at 1:30 p.m., enjoy a Civil War presentation by Barrington native and BHS graduate Rog Cogswell, the chairman of the Civil War Trust in Washington, D.C.

Over the summer, work has continued to progress on Barrington's White House. The original stairs were repaired, and the rest of the first floor wainscoting has been restored, including the ornate entrance between the Front Entry and the Drawing Room. The rest of the wood floors were completed and have been buffed to a beautiful sheen. The ballroom carpets, drapery, lighting, bathrooms and flooring have been installed and the room is breathtaking. Finally, the non-profit offices and volunteer spaces are complete and the tenants are moving in the first week of September. The front porch floor has been sanded and stained, the heaters have been installed and the new railings are all in place.

We hope you will come and see the house now that the construction is complete and the decorating committee has worked their magic to add those special touches. The house will be open from 12:00 -4:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 26 and Sunday, September 27.

The Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) is arranging for a document destruction company to be in the North Commuter Parking Lot at Main and Wool Streets in Barrington on October 17, 2015 from 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m., rain or shine. Free of charge, Barrington residents (with proof of residency) can bring items such as bank statements, medical forms, personal files, and retired tax forms to be safely shredded.

Staples and paper clips do not need to be removed, but please remove binders. Also, at the same time, you can recycle your electronic materials, such as printers, monitors, keyboards, DVR's, TV's etc. Please visit www.swancc.org for a list of acceptable materials.

It's chipper time again! In early October the chipper will come through your neighborhood to chop up all those tree branches. Make Your Home the Solution to Stormwater Pollution!

As stormwater flows over driveways, lawns, and sidewalks, it picks up debris, chemicals, dirt, and other pollutants. Stormwater can flow into a storm sewer system or directly into a lake, stream, river, or wetland. Anything that enters a storm sewer system is discharged untreated into the waterbodies we use for swimming, fishing, and providing drinking water. Polluted runoff is the nation's greatest threat to clean water.

By practicing healthy household habits, homeowners can keep common pollutants like pesticides, pet waste, grass clippings, and automotive fluids off the ground and out of stormwater. Adopt these healthy household habits and help protect lakes, streams, rivers, and wetlands. Remember to share the habits with your neighbors!

For instance, when walking your pet, remember to pick up the waste and dispose of it properly. Flushing pet waste is the best disposal method. Leaving pet waste on the ground increases public health risks by allowing harmful bacteria and nutrients to wash into the storm drain and eventually into local waterbodies. National Preparedness Month

While September is National Preparedness Month, the Village works throughout the year to enhance our emergency response to protect residents. Village staff, including representatives of Fire, Police, Public Works and Administration, meet regularly to plan our mitigation efforts and response to disasters. Elected Officials and staff members from each department are trained to the level required by Homeland Security for their particular position in the organization. This effort is continuous and has enhanced collaboration between departments to reach Village goals to protect the community.

As part of our communication and safety efforts, a monthly test of the Village of Barrington early warning systems have been established, including: tornado siren testing (first Tuesday of the month at 10:00 a.m.), social media (second Tuesday of the month at 10:00 a.m.), Blackboard Connect Reverse 9-1-1 (third Tuesday of the month at 10:00 a.m.), and Cable Channel 4 (fourth Tuesday of the month at 10:00 a.m.). To get timely alerts on local news, emergency bulletins, or crime alerts from the Village's reverse 9-1-1 system, please visit www.barrington-il.gov where you will have the ability to set your preferences and enter email or text numbers, as desired.

Residents are reminded to review their individual family preparations by visiting www.ready.gov to prepare, plan and stay informed. A few minutes of preparation now is insurance that your family will be better protected throughout the year.

Village Board Meeting Summary

At the Village Board meetings held July 20th and August 3rd the Village Board took action on several items. The following is a summary of some of those items.

Public Hearing: A public hearing was held regarding the issuance of \$8.0 million in Alternate Revenue Bonds (Water and Sewer, Series 2015). In conjunction with this public hearing, an ordinance was passed to proceed with the issuance of the bonds to provide funding for several water and sewer capital projects, including the reconstruction of a significant sanitary sewer line from the Russell-Summit-Lincoln area to the end of Liberty Street and the reconstruction of the water main along Hart Road.

Phone and Data Services: A resolution was approved approving Call One to provide phone and data services. The contract for these services was bid by the Suburban Purchasing Cooperative and the Village took advantage of the favorable contract services and pricing received as a result of the bid process.

Water Tower Cleaning: A resolution was approved authorizing National Wash Authority, LLC to wash and remove mildew staining on the Village's three water towers that are used for fire suppression and to maintain pressure in the Village's potable water distribution system.

Disposal of Property: The Police Department was granted authorization to sell a Segway that is no longer useful for Village purposes.

800 S. Cook Street Variation: An ordinance was passed approving a variation for the location of an accessory structure and a decrease in the required setbacks for the purpose of building a detached garage.

Environmental Cleanup – Bazos Cleaners: An ordinance was approved prohibiting the use of groundwater as potable water supply by the installation of or use of existing wells within the area containing Bazos Cleaners.

T-Mobile Leases: The Board approved two cellular antenna leases at the Library and Manchester Water Towers.

Overnight Parking at Barrington Village Center: A Village Code amendment was approved setting forth parking restrictions at the new Barrington Village Center (corner of Hough and Main Streets).

Barrington's White House: The Board approved an amended lease with Barrington Children's Charities by changing the commencement date of their lease. In addition, a resolution was approved authorizing the purchase of furnishings from Bright Settings.
