Motorists and Bicyclists: Test Your Knowledge

How well do you know Illinois laws and safety techniques regarding car-bicycle interactions? www.bikesafetyquiz.com is an online resource to brush up on your skills.

Bicycling is a fun way for people to be active and healthy. Biking is also used for transportation, either by choice or necessity. But, most of us received little or no training in school or Driver's Ed on proper riding – or driving around bikes.

To help fill the gap, the League of Illinois Bicyclists, a statewide bicycle organization, has developed www.bikesafetyquiz.com. The interactive resource includes separate quiz lessons for Adult Bicyclists, Child Bicyclists, and Motorists.

In each lesson, users progress through a total of 25-33 multiple-choice questions divided into bronze, silver, and gold levels. The learning comes from explanations in the question response feedback, with users getting up to three chances to answer each question correctly. If users finish at least one level, they may create a "certificate of completion" to print or email. The Secretary of State was a project partner.

The Village encourages residents – bicyclists and motorists alike – to take the quiz. We'll all get where we're going more safely.




Texting and Driving Awareness

Village Board Meeting Summary

At the Village Board meetings held August 17th, September 8th, and September 14th, the Village Board took action on several items. The following is a summary of some of those items.

Appointment of Todd Sholeen: Todd Sholeen was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Robert Windon until that office is filled at the Consolidated Election in 2017.

Hiring of Staff: There were several motions approved authorizing staff to fill positions in Public Works and one position in the Police Department.

Zoning Variations: The Village Board considered several zoning variations for properties on Bosworthfield Road, Russell Street, and Westwood Drive.

Sale of Property: An ordinance was approved authorizing the sale of a sliver of land along Liberty Street.

Engineering Services: Gewalt Hamilton Associates, Inc. was retained to provide engineering and design services related to the 2016 Hart Road Watermain Improvement Project and preparation of construction documents for the improvements of the intersection of South Cook Street and East Station Street.

Auditing Services: Lauterbach & Amen's contract for auditing services was renewed for one year.

Portable Radios Purchase: The Police Department was authorized to purchase four portable radios to enable officers to communicate on the STARCOM21 digital network.

Code Amendments: There were several code amendments approved related to liquor sales.

Public Works Equipment: The Village Board authorized the purchase of a truck mounted Automated Hydraulic Water Valve Exerciser to assist with routine maintenance on water valves within the water distribution system. In addition, they also authorized the replacement of the grit removal tank in the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). A new boiler was purchased from Porter Pipe & Supply Co. to replace the boiler unit at the WWTP and JM Mechanical was hired to complete the installation of the boiler.

Lift Station Improvements: A contract was approved with Patnick Construction for the Sewage Lift Station #2 Force Main Improvement Project.

SCADA System Upgrades: The Village Board authorized the upgrade of the Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system. This system allows for the monitoring and maintenance of the water and wastewater systems. The project upgrade consists of new computers, server, Programmable Logic Controllers (PLCs), software, and cash allowance for screen upgrades.

Huff & Huff, Inc.: The Village contracted with Huff & Huff, Inc. to complete two projects for Public Works. The first is to evaluate phosphorous removal at the wastewater treatment facility to prepare reports required by the new National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit. The second is to analyze current data and draft a new Capacity, Management, Operations, and Maintenance (CMOM) Plan, as required by the NPDES permit.

Scarecrow Fest: The Village Board authorized the use of Village property and sound amplification from the annual Scarecrow Fest to be held October 10, 2015.





Safety Tips for a Happy Halloween

Halloween is a cherished tradition, but the excitement of the night can cause children to forget to be careful. Please review the safety tips below and share them with your child to ensure a safe Halloween.

- Use face paint instead of masks to ensure your children can see well, and provide them with lights or reflective tape to ensure that they can be seen by others.
- Instruct your children to approach only those homes that are well-lit and never to enter a stranger's home.
- Instruct your children to eat nothing until they come home and the treats have been inspected by you.
- Instruct your children to travel only in familiar areas and along an established route.
- Do not light your pumpkin with a candle; instead use a flashlight or cold chemical light-stick.
- Autumn leaves, dry corn stalks, berry branches, similar fall decorations, and even some Halloween costumes can be hazardous. Keep lighted bulbs, open fires, and even adult smoking materials at a safe distance.
