Emerald Ash Borer Update



The Village continues to inspect, tag & remove infested ash trees located on the public way. It is important to try and get these dead trees down in a timely manner as they become extremely brittle after just one year following death. Unlike dead elms that could stand for 10 years or more and be relatively stable, the infested ash trees dry out quickly and become hazardous in a short amount of time.

If you have a dead ash tree on your property, for your safety and the safety of surrounding neighbors, please take that ash tree down promptly. Thank you in advance for your cooperation. Dog Tags are Due July 1st

These tags are only \$5 and can mean the difference between losing your dog and the Police Department returning your dog safely to you. Village Achieves Solid Financial Performance in 2015

In late June, the Village Board reviewed the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2015. The CAFR is the end result of the audit process and presents financial statements for all of the Village's accounting funds. As in previous years, the 2015 audit concluded with an unmodified opinion from the auditor attesting that the CAFR presents the Village's finances "fairly, in all material respects." In addition, the Village received the Government Finance Officers Association Award for Excellence in Financial Reporting for the 31st year in a row for its 2014 CAFR. The 2015 CAFR incorporates Governmental Accounting Standards Board Statement 68 which profoundly changed the reporting of pension assets and liabilities thereby making it difficult to compare the 2015 CAFR to prior years.

At the end of 2015, the Village's Net Position, which is equal to total assets less total liabilities, equaled \$73.3 million, including \$70.4 million invested in capital assets, \$1.2 million in restricted net position, and \$1.7 million in unrestricted net position. The Village's current assets of \$32.9 million were 5.4 times greater than the Village's current liabilities of \$6.0 million at the end of 2015.

The General Fund, which provides the bulk of services such as public safety and public works, achieved an excess of revenues over expenditures in 2015 of \$1,070,023 and transferred \$1.0 million to the Capital Improvement Fund for future infrastructure projects. At the end of 2015, the General Fund's ending Fund Balance equaled \$8.6 million and included the equivalent of 4.18 months of expenditures in the Unassigned Fund Balance, the portion of the Fund Balance that can be used to meet ongoing obligations to residents and creditors.

In addition to the strong performance in the General Fund, significant investments in the Village's infrastructure occurred in 2015. The Capital Improvement, Water & Sewer, and Barrington's White House Funds together expended \$11.4 million to improve, reconstruct, or repair infrastructure, buildings, and equipment in the community. The projects completed in 2015 include the renovation of Barrington's White House which was funded by private donations, the construction of the Barrington Village Center parking lot and retail pads, and the reconstruction of the Lift Station #2 Forcemain.

The Village continued to improve its financial position in 2015. The Village has maintained financial discipline during the turbulent economic events of the past decade by maintaining minimum staffing levels, controlling operating expenses, and continuing to provide services as efficiently as possible. The austerity in expenses, combined with improving revenues, have produced multiple years of solid financial results for the Village and have contributed to its positive financial position.



The Village has an ordinance establishing limitations on water use. *We also ask that you make a conscious effort to conserve this precious resource throughout the remaining summer.*

Water conservation tips:

Run dishwashers and washing machines with a full load only (unless reduced fill settings are available).

When washing a car, rinse it once. Use a bucket of soapy water to wash it, and then rinse it once more quickly. Taking a car to a car wash may save water since many commercial installations recycle their water.

Take shorter showers. Turn down the faucets and try a low-flow shower head. A typical five-minute shower can use over 40 gallons of water. A shower of seven minutes or longer can consume more water than a bath.

One inch of rain or watering over a 7 to 10 day period is sufficient to maintain a healthy lawn. There is no need to water every day, as it promotes weak, shallow, rooted grass.

A typical toilet leak can waste thousands of gallons of water each year.

Reset automatic irrigation systems to meet the changing Village water status. Watering during the morning hours is best for your lawn to prevent evaporation loss.

Don't leave water running when shaving, brushing teeth, washing hair, or washing dishes.

Grass beginning to turn brown during dry conditions has become dormant and will revive after a normal rainfall.

A small drip from a leaking faucet can waste 70 gallons of water each day. Replace worn washers.

Avoid sprinklers that produce a fine mist. Too much water is lost to the wind and evaporation.

Insulate hot water pipes between the heater and the faucets to reduce the amount of water that must be run to get hot water.

Sweep sidewalks and driveways, instead of washing them.

Village Board Meeting Summary

At the Village Board meetings held May 23, 2016 and June 13, 2016, the Village Board took action on several items. The following is a summary of some of those items.

Andres Medical Billing: The Village Board authorized a renegotiated contract with AMB securing a 25% reduction in contract fees.

Public Works Truck: The Village Board authorized the purchase of a budgeted new 2017 International 7400 5-Ton truck with dump body, snow plow, underbelly plow, liquids tank/system and salt spreader with spinner. This new truck replaces a 2001 5-Ton Dump Truck.

Office Assistant: The Village Board authorized the hiring of a new full-time Office Assistant for the Economic Development Department and Barrington's White House.

FOP Agreement: An agreement has been reached with the Illinois Fraternal Order of Police Labor Council.

Gewalt Hamilton Agreements: The Village Board approved agreements with Gewalt Hamilton for the North Commuter Lot access at Route 14 and the Safe Routes to School improvements on Lageschulte and Illinois Ave.

Road Patching Program: Chicagoland Paving Contractors was hired to undertake road patching for 2016.

Code Amendments: Several code amendments were approved relative to the liquor code and authorizing additional liquor licenses.


