Relay for Life - June 10, 2016

The 19th ANNUAL American Cancer Society Relay For Life to support the fight for a cancer-free world will be held on Friday, June 10, 2016 at Barrington High School starting at 5:00 p.m.

Relay For Life brings the community together to honor individuals who have fought against cancer. Survivors, their families and all those who have been affected by this disease come together to walk, run, and camp out around a track to create a united network of support and dedication. Some of the ways in which participants will be raising funds to support the American Cancer Society include "Painting the Town Purple" where artists from the Barrington Cultural Arts Center will have art on display and for auction. Also, participants will use decorated cardboard cars and pick up their patient at the patient's home and deliver him/her to the treatment center. This is a reenactment of an actual program called "Road To Recovery" provided by American Cancer Society. Construction materials and boxes provided by Leopardo Construction and UPS Barrington, respectively. A silent auction will be held with items provided by local restaurants and shops. The event includes exceptional local talent from the best of Barrington Performing Arts, Barrington Idol finalists, Bataille Academie of the Dance, and Barrington Children's Choir and a vintage karaoke truck for all participants.

The relay begins with a **Survivor Lap**, an inspiring time where survivors are honored by participants in support of their incredible fight. One of the most memorable events during the night is the **Luminaria Ceremony**; where everyone has the opportunity to light a luminaria and take a moment to honor those who have beat the disease, those who are still fighting, and those who have courageously fought but have lost their lives to cancer.

Funds raised at Relay For Life support programs and services for patients and their families in Barrington. The American Cancer Society's Look Good Feel Better program provides cancer patients with beauty techniques to help them cope and feel good about themselves during radiation and chemotherapy, and other cancer treatments.



Storm Management Help: Lawn Care

Excess fertilizers and pesticides applied to lawns and gardens wash off and pollute streams. In addition, yard clippings and leaves can wash into storm drains and contribute nutrients and organic matter to streams.

- Don't over water your lawn. Consider using a soaker hose instead of a sprinkler.
- Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly. When use is necessary, use these chemicals in the recommended amounts. Use organic mulch or safer pest control methods whenever possible.
- Compost or mulch yard waste. Don't leave it in the street or sweep it into storm drains or streams.
- Cover piles of dirt or mulch being used in landscaping projects.

Sanitary Sewer Replacement

Over the last several years, the Village completed a comprehensive Sanitary Sewer Study which determined a major sanitary sewer line that conveys flow from the south side of town to the north side is in poor condition, and requires replacement. The project will replace approximately one mile of outdated and deficient sanitary sewer, much of which was installed prior to 1950.

The Village of Barrington is currently in the design and permitting stages of the project. The streets and areas affected by this project are as follows:

- **Liberty Street, from west end to North Avenue.**
- **Cook Street, from Washington Street to Liberty Street.**
- **North Avenue, from Liberty Street to Main Street.**
- **Main Street, from North Avenue to Wool Street.**
- **Wool Street, from Main Street to the North Commuter Parking Lot.**
- **The North Commuter Parking Lot.**
- **The South Commuter Parking Lot.**
- **Summit Street, from the South Commuter Parking Lot to Russell Street.**
- **Russell Street, from Summit Street to Spring Street.**

This project will be one of the largest utility projects undertaken by the Village in recent years. Staff is currently working on the engineering and design phase of the project. Construction is currently anticipated to begin in February, 2017, with a tentative substantial completion date at the end of November, 2017.

A Public Information Meeting will be held at Village Hall from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm on Monday, June 20th, 2016.

Village Board Meeting Summary

At the Village Board meetings held April 25, 2016, May 2, 2016, and May 9, 2016, the Village Board took action on several items. The following is a summary of some of those items.

Barrington's White House: The Village Board adopted revised policies relating to the use and operations of BWH, in addition to amending a resolution relative to the BWH Advisory Board

Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project: The Village has an existing contract with Gewalt Hamilton to survey portions of the Village and design a replacement sanitary sewer from the Russell-Summit-Lincoln area, through the Commuter Parking lots, along North Avenue and Liberty Street. As the design progressed, it became evident that modifications to the route and additional design for related storm water facilities would be required. The Board approved a change order authorizing additional engineering services that are required to accommodate these modifications to the project scope.

License Agreement with Park District: As part of the Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project currently in design, the Village wishes to perform soil borings in portions of Langendorf Park and Miller Park to properly assess the soil conditions. The Park District has agreed to allow the investigation provided a License Agreement has been executed between the two agencies for any areas outside of existing utility easements.

Cook/ Station Streets Intersection Improvement Project: The Village Board authorized a contract related to the 2016 Cook Street and Station Street Intersection Project, which include pavement reconstruction, sidewalk, curb, and gutter replacement as needed to improve the accessible ramps and crosswalks at the intersection of Cook Street and Station Street. This project also includes the removal and replacement of pavers at Memorial Park.


Disposal of Surplus Property: The Fire Department has accumulated an abundant amount of property that is no longer needed and should be donated or disposed of as scrap or waste.

Liquor Code Amendment: The Village Board authorized a Class 9 Liquor License for the new Farmhouse on North.


