Work Has Begun on Major Sanitary Sewer Project Along Liberty Street

Work has begun on the major sanitary sewer project occurring in 2017 along Liberty Street, North Avenue, and Wool Street. In 2018, the project will continue on into the North Commuter Lot and onto Russell Street.

The Village is undertaking this Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project to replace one mile of aging sanitary sewer, as well as provide storm sewer and roadway improvements.

Project construction has begun on West Liberty Street and will continue this spring and summer down East Liberty and onto North Avenue.

For approximately two weeks in mid-July, the project will necessitate the

GOOD NEWS! Sales Tax Revenues Break a Village Record in 2016!

The Village of Barrington's Director of Financial Services, Jason Hayden, has reported that sales tax revenues neared \$5.1 million in 2016 – the highest total in the Village's history and an 8.2% increase over 2015. Village officials attribute the increase to a growing retail tax base and increased car dealership sales toward the end of 2016.

Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation Visited Barrington's White House

Representatives from the Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation visited Barrington's White House on Monday, March 6th to tour the completed project and meet with the team that worked on the project. Following the successful completion of the grant paperwork, the Village received \$150,000 payout of grant funds at the end of 2016. Barrington's White House was the first **Gold LEED** certified building in Barrington, and the first geothermal installation.

The fund from the grant supported the installation of a geothermal system and the design and commissioning costs for LEED certification. The geothermal system and new HVAC equipment is expected to save 126,338 kWh per year, which could save \$12,635 annually in utility bills. The renovation is a point of pride for the community and many of the companies and contractors that worked on it were local to the Barrington area.

The Facts About Village Finances

As the Village's president, I believe it is my responsibility to set the record straight when it comes to the state of the Village's finances. In our 24/7 world of social media and 10-second sound bites, information can get distorted or lost in the shuffle as we hear bits and pieces of what we think is going on inside our Village government.

But it's critical for our residents – our taxpayers – to understand the true state of our finances and to have confidence in the elected officials and staff that work hard every day to serve the Village and its residents. So below are the facts as presented by our Director of Financial Services, [Jason Hayden](#):

>>> By law and practice, the Village always produces a balanced budget. Since 2011, the Village has had an average annual surplus in the General Fund of \$1.2 million. These surpluses are then transferred to capital improvements or applied to outstanding pension contributions.





>>> Sales tax revenues have increased 55% since 2009. We had a record-breaking year in 2016, with our highest sales tax revenue ever, at \$5.1 million.

>>> Moody's has given the Village an Aa+ Bond Rating, which is the highest rating we can achieve as a non home-rule municipality of our size.

>>> The Village's Total Assets to Liabilities:
Assets = \$136.3 Million
Liabilities = \$56.4 million

>>> The Village's Total Liabilities of \$56.4 million include \$23.6 million in pension liabilities (42% of total liabilities). These liabilities are mandated by the state and, according to accounting rules changes in 2015, must be reported as a part of the overall Village liabilities on our balance sheet.

Call Before You Dig!



You may be surprised by what's buried in your yard. That's because most electric, gas, water, sewer and telecommunications companies are delivering utility services underground. To avoid personal injury and damage to those underground lines, state law requires you to contact JULIE before any digging project, regardless of the project size or depth. Both the call and JULIE's services are free. You can prevent injury and avoid damage by following these four important steps:

- Call or Click before you dig
- Wait the required amount of time (two working days after your phone call)
- Respect the marks
- Dig with care

Notify JULIE if you are doing any of the following projects: decks and patios, trees or shrubs, swing sets, signs, fountains, tents, fences, mailbox posts, room additions, gardens, swimming pools, landscaping, etc.

Safeguarding Our Water Supply

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) requires every Illinois municipal water supplier to develop and implement a comprehensive Cross Connection Control Program designed to safeguard the public water supply. The Village of Barrington by Municipal Code, Chapter 6 "Cross Connection Control" adopted such a program.

For the Village of Barrington to remain compliant, cooperation from all residential and commercial property owners is essential and a critical part of this program. Should you ever receive any requests for information from the Village of Barrington or our subcontractor, Aqua Backflow, who manages this program for the Village, please respond accordingly.

Aqua Backflow specializes in cross connection control program management and is familiar with the State of Illinois regulations and requirements for testing, repairs, and maintenance of backflow devices. If you have or require backflow protection because you have a pool, irrigation system, fire sprinkler system, or heating system/boilers, you must comply with these regulations. Sanitary Sewer Back-Up?

If you experience a sanitary sewer back-up due to an extreme rain event, please contact the Public Works Department as soon as possible, Monday through Friday, at (847) 381-7903 or after hours at (847) 270-9111 and a Village representative will come out to confirm the backup and investigate the source of the problem.

Fire Hydrant Flushing Schedule

April 23 – May 5 (10:30 p.m. - 7:00 a.m.)

Flushing will occur in the Village of Barrington, Paganica of Barrington Hills, and Braymore, Weatherstone, Glencrest, and Sanctuary of Inverness

May 8 - 10 (7:00 a.m. - 3:30 p.m.)

Flushing will occur in Abbey Woods and Estates of Inverness Ridge

The Village conducts an annual flushing of the water distribution system to eliminate as much mineral content as possible from the domestic water supply. Fire hydrant flushing removes a considerable amount of loose mineral content and “settleable” solids that accumulate in the water supply system over a period of time.

Flushing will occur from April 23 through May 10 (as listed above, weather permitting). You may experience discoloration, low water pressure, and rusty water during flushing operations. This may occur during the entire flushing period, even when flushing may not be in your immediate area. Although water may be discolored, it is safe to drink; however, until the water runs clear, you should avoid washing clothes, especially whites. Call Public Works at (847) 381-7903 for more info.

Spring Chipper Schedule

Monday, May 9 - North of Main Street

Monday, May 16 - South of Main Street

Please have all the material out to the curb by 7:00 a.m. on your designated Monday morning. The Chipper will make only ONE pass through your neighborhood. Branches may be up to 10” in diameter and at least 4’ in length. Stack branches neatly in a long, low pile on the parkway, with the cut end facing the curb. Public Works crews cannot pick up material on private property. The following items cannot be picked up: root balls and stumps; building materials; anything with nails, wire or bolts; any materials placed in a box or garbage can; grass; leaves; or any materials other than wooded branch materials. Remember to utilize your Groot yard waste tote throughout the season.

National Bike to School Day: May 10, 2017



The National Bike to School Day began in 2012, and Barrington

has been a proud participant for the past five years. National Bike to School Day not only encourages children to ride their bikes to school, but to learn about bike safety and promote a healthy lifestyle. This year, Bike to School Day falls on Wednesday, May 10, 2017. It’s a great way to kick start National Bike Month!

As we approach another bike riding season, here are a few bicycle safety and maintenance tips to help make bicycling more fun! Just like driving a car, there are rules for riding your bike:

- >> **Ride on the right side of the road or trail, because drivers expect, and look for, other traffic on the right.**
- >> **Obey traffic laws—signs and signals, including stoplights.**
- >> **Look back before turning or moving left.**
- >> **Ride single file if there are cars behind you.**
- >> **Use hand signals to let drivers know what you are going to do.**
- >> **Be careful of people walking — warn them you are coming.**
- >> **Look out for cars backing up — they may not see you.**
- >> **Don’t ride too close to parked cars.**
- >> **Feel unsafe? You can always walk your bike.**

Properly maintaining your bicycle is vital to riding safely. Check it yourself before each ride with the ABC Quick Check:

AIR: Pinch the tires, they should be hard, with good air pressure.

BRAKES: Make sure they work and aren’t rubbing the tire.

CRANK/CHAIN: If there are problems with your gears or if the chain is loose, take it to a bike shop for repairs

QUICK: Check “quick release levers” and other bolts to make sure they are tight.

Finally, your helmet should be worn the right way: First, put on your helmet so it is level and snug — if it slides around, you need thicker pads.

EYES: You should see the very edge of your helmet when you look up past your eyebrow.

EARS: The straps should meet right under your ear to form a Y.

MOUTH: The strap should be loose enough so you can breathe and insert one or two fingers between the buckle and your skin, but tight enough that if you drop your jaw, you can feel the helmet pull down the top of your head.


