## Temporary Fence Installed to Protect Plants

The Village has installed temporary fencing around its planters in the downtown area. In the past, the Village has used plastic silt fencing to protect the thousands of dollars invested in perennial plantings from road salt. This year, we are trying out a new look for the temporary fencing and hope that this improves the appearance during this dreary winter season. The fencing needs to weather before being stained or painted for next season's installation. The fencing is used to protect the soil during the winter months to allow revegetation to occur in the spring.

## Be Prepared for Winter Weather

We've had a mild winter so far, but be prepared for our area's bitter cold, as temperatures can fluctuate 40 degrees in a 24-hour period. Here are some tips on how you can minimize the cold misery:

**Bundle Up:** It might seem obvious, but piling on a few extra layers is a great way to stay warm, especially if you have to be outside.

**Watch Out for Furry Friends:** You might be jealous of your pet's fur coat when temperatures drop, but they need to be kept warm, too. Always remember to bring pets inside when temperatures begin to drop.

**Assemble a Car Emergency Kit:** Visit the Illinois Emergency Management Agency's website at [www.illinois.gov/iema/Preparedness](http://www.illinois.gov/iema/Preparedness) for information on how to prepare a winter storm survival kit.

**Keep Heat Constant:** Setting your thermostat at the same temperature day and night will help prevent your pipes from freezing and bursting.



**Watch for Signs of Hypothermia:** Prolonged exposure to cold temperatures can result in hypothermia, or abnormally low body temperature.

**Help your Neighbors:** Be on the lookout for neighbors in need. Sometimes something as simple as a phone call or knocking on the door of an elderly neighbor or relative in the bitter cold weather we are experiencing can literally save a life. It only takes a moment to check in and make sure that your elderly neighbors or relatives are doing alright. If you feel that a neighbor may be in danger if they remain alone, ask them to come over and spend some time at your place until the temperature rises a little.

## Moving Forward with Several Village Projects

Over the past few months, the Village Board has hosted several opportunities for residents to come in and get updated on projects throughout the Village. In case you missed one of the three Coffee and Conversation with the Village Board that were held, the following is a brief summary of some of the projects that were discussed.

**North Commuter Entrance Drive & Traffic Signal:** A new entrance drive is scheduled to be constructed at the North commuter lot and will have access directly to Northwest Highway, reducing traffic on Main Street and enhancing safety with a traffic signal.

**Streetscape Improvements:** The corners at the intersection of Station and Cook Streets were updated with accessible ramps and high visibility crosswalks. The project was completed before the holiday season began for our retailers.

**Memorial Park:** The park, located on Hough Street across from Hough Street School, received some upgrades by replacing brick pavers creating a new, smoother walkway and adding high efficiency lighting.

**Dundee Road and Grove Avenue:** IDOT is planning to construct the Intersection improvements including a traffic light, dedicated turn lanes, and improved level of service in the summer and fall of 2017. Bike path improvements will also help to increase connectivity to the school and downtown.

**Hart Road Improvements:** The intersection and reconstruction project at Hart Road and Route 14 will include both additional inbound and outbound turn lanes bringing about reduced intersection wait times. There will also be additional sidewalks along Northwest Highway, Hart Road, and Main Street along the High School, to complete connectivity and offer safe pedestrian passage. Lake County Division of Transportation is planning to begin construction in spring of 2018.

**Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project:** This sewer replacement project will increase capacity and reduce inflow and infiltration into our system. In addition, a new Miller Park storm water facility will reduce the risk of flooding.

**Lake Zurich Road Realignment:** The engineering design and land acquisition for this project are ongoing.

**CN Underpass:** IDOT is presently appraising properties on Elm Road for acquisitions to advance this project. The Village and IDOT are currently working together to secure funding for final engineering and construction.

## Train Problems? Don't Just Fume - Take Action

As the CN traffic builds on the EJ&E line, we understand that resident frustrations are building as well. In August, about two-thirds of CN's overall projected traffic ran on the EJ&E. Across the greater Barrington area, we are hearing the complaints loud and clear about travel delays due to blocked crossings; freight running during peak commuter hours and gridlocking the roads; horns and wayside noise at all hours; and idling trains sitting for long hours.

Because we expect this traffic volume to ebb and flow in the months ahead, it's important that you know you have the power to register your complaints to the Surface Transportation Board during the oversight period for this rail merger. Don't waste the opportunity to tell federal regulators how CN operations are impacting the quality of life in our community.

If you are bothered by CN's operations, go to [www.FightRailCongestion.com](http://www.FightRailCongestion.com) and click onto the "Register Rail Complaint" icon on the home page. Add this website to your mobile devices, so the next time you are stalled in traffic watching a mile-long train crawl by and blocking traffic for more than 10 minutes, you can do more than just fume! Whether you are at home or in your car, it's important that the STB hears from us. Otherwise, they will conclude that things are running smoothly.

## Winter Parking

**November 1<sup>st</sup> through March 31<sup>st</sup>**

To allow snow plows to safely maneuver and clean the streets for emergency response vehicles, parking is not permitted after 1:00 a.m. on streets within the Central Business District when snow accumulation is over two inches, until snow removal operations are complete. Parking is not permitted at any time on residential streets outside of the Central Business District when snow accumulation is two inches or more, until snow removal operations are complete. Just as a reminder, parking is always prohibited on all Village Streets between the hours of 1:00 A.M. until 6:00 A.M. Village snow removal crews typically complete post storm clean-up of Village streets during the hours of 1:00 A.M. and 6:00 A.M. after the storm has ended. Please refrain from parking on the street until after all snow and ice control efforts have been completed.



Please keep your fire hydrant clear of snow. It will greatly help the firefighters in case of fire.

## Sidewalk Snow Removal

During snow storms, watch Channel 4 and the Village's website [www.barrington-il.gov](http://www.barrington-il.gov) for detailed snow removal tips. Like most municipalities in northern Illinois, the Village requires residents and business owners to clear snow and ice from the sidewalks adjacent to your property. Keeping your sidewalk clear is important for preventing hazardous conditions for pedestrians. Please remember to do your part to help assure the safety of your neighborhoods and customers by making sure your sidewalk is promptly cleared.

### Snow Piled at End of Driveways

Because there are more than 3,800 driveways in the Village, we do not have enough equipment and personnel to clear snow at the end of driveways. We recommend waiting until the street has been plowed from curb to curb before clearing your driveway.
