Doing projects outside your home this summer, such as decks and patios, trees or shrubs, swing sets, signs, fountains, tents, fences, mailbox posts, room additions, gardens, swimming pools, landscaping, etc.?



**To avoid personal injury and damage to underground electric, gas, sewer, and telecommunications lines, state law requires you to contact JULIE before any digging project,** regardless of the project size or depth. You must then wait 2 working days for Julie to mark your digging location.

Simply call 8-1-1 or 1 (800) 892-0123 to place a locate request. Both the call and JULIE's services are free.

### Stay in the Know by Signing Up for Reverse 9-1-1, E-News, and Social Media

As your Village President, it's important to me that Barrington residents have the information they need about everything going on in the Village, from Public Works projects and street closures, events, and breaking news such as major weather events or urgent police or fire situations. We have a number of communication tools that we use to provide information, including the newsletter you're reading now, which is currently mailed to all residents. In addition, we have a number of other tools we use to communicate:

#### Social Media: Facebook, Twitter, and Next Door

Recently we've increased our presence on social media. Here you'll find breaking news as well as posts about local happenings and events. If you haven't followed us yet at "Village of Barrington," please be sure to do so – when things are happening in Barrington, you'll want to turn here first!

#### Bi-Weekly E-Newsletter

We've also recently begun sending a bi-weekly E-Newsletter to our residents. Currently we have more than 4,500 subscribers on our e-mail list. But you won't receive it if you don't sign up, so please subscribe by going to [www.barrington-il.gov](http://www.barrington-il.gov) and click on "quick links" at the top of the page.

#### Reverse 9-1-1 for Urgent Communication

The Village of Barrington provides instant communication to our residents via Blackboard Connect service ("reverse 9-1-1"). The Village can send personalized voice, e-mail, and text messages via cell phones, home phones, and work phones to residents and businesses with specific information about urgent situations such as evacuations, crime alerts, police activity, weather events, missing child alerts, and more.

This is a critical tool that we use in urgent situations, and while the service is 100% voluntary, I hope you will participate in order to receive timely messages from the Village. If you would like to provide your contact information, I encourage you to visit the Village's website at [www.barrington-il.gov](http://www.barrington-il.gov). Or, if you prefer, you can call (847) 304-3300 with your name, address, and the phone numbers and/or e-mail addresses you wish to add.

Participation in all of these services is 100% free and completely voluntary. You can opt-out at any time. We know that maintaining the privacy of your personal information is important, and rest assured that the Village of Barrington will not share your information with anyone.

# Board Approves Roslyn Meadows Townhome Development

**On Monday evening, May 8, the Village Board of Trustees heard numerous comments from local residents regarding the planned Roslyn Meadows townhome development on Cumnor Avenue. After listening to and carefully considering residents' concerns, the Board voted unanimously to approve the project.**

The trustees cited the low density of the project and the fact that the current M1 zoning could likely provide for a 50,000-square-foot industrial use of the land as opposed to six townhome buildings, which they felt would be a better option for the neighborhood.

## Tips for Proper Lawn Care to Minimize Stormwater Runoff Issues

Excess fertilizers and pesticides applied to lawns and gardens wash off and pollute streams. In addition, yard clippings and leaves can wash into storm drains and contribute nutrients and organic matter to streams.

- >> **Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly.** When use is necessary, use these chemicals in the recommended amounts. Use organic mulch or safer pest control methods whenever possible.
- >> **Don't over-water your lawn.** Consider using a soaker hose instead of a sprinkler.
- >> **Compost or mulch yard waste.** Don't leave it in the street or sweep it into storm drains or streams.
- >> **Cover piles of dirt or mulch** being used in landscaping projects.

## Village Saves Residents Over \$300 in Electric Supply Costs

Several years ago, there was a change in the state law that allowed municipalities to outsource their electrical supplier away from ComEd. As such, in 2012 Barrington residents approved a referendum that authorized the Village Board to enact an Electrical Aggregation Program. [This initiative allows the Village to solicit and negotiate bids for electrical supply on residents' behalf](#), which has resulted in [lower costs](#) than would have been provided by residents using ComEd as their supplier.



Over the past five years, [the Village has saved residents an average of \\$332](#) in electric supply costs per household, for a cumulative Village-wide savings of \$1.1 million.

Currently, the Village contracts with DYNEGY for its electrical supply (electrical infrastructure is still provided by ComEd), and [the current DYNEGY rate is 0.8 cents per kilowatt hour lower than the current ComEd rate](#), resulting in significant monthly savings for Village residents. The contract with DYNEGY will expire in August, and the Village is currently in the process of bidding the electrical supply contract. A further update on the Village's aggregation program pricing will be provided in August when the new contract will begin.

It should be noted that residents are free to opt out of this aggregation program at any time; however, most residents have expressed that they prefer to allow the Village to negotiate lower rates on their behalf, rather than interact with door-to-door salespeople or receive phone solicitations from electrical providers. 
