# Improvements at Hart Rd./ Rt.14 to Begin in 2018

Many residents have expressed concern about the Hart Road/ Rt. 14 intersection, as well as the lack of a sidewalk or pedestrian walkway along Hart Road to Barrington High School and into downtown.

The Village has been working with the Lake County Division of Transportation to begin a reconstruction project in spring 2018 at Hart Road and Route 14 that will include both additional inbound and outbound turn lanes for reduced intersection wait times.

The project will also include additional sidewalks along Northwest Highway, Hart Road, and Main Street along Barrington High School, which will complete connectivity and offer safe pedestrian passage. ## GOOD NEWS! A Property Tax Reduction is coming in 2018

Village residents will see a decrease in the Village portion of their property tax bills in 2018 and 2019. The decrease comes from retiring bonds issued in 1998 to replace our 100-year old Village Hall and to build a new Public Safety Facility on Northwest Highway. The property tax levy will decrease by 8.37% in 2017, affecting 2018 bills, and the 2018 levy affecting our 2019 bills will decrease by an additional 9.96%.

### DID YOU KNOW?

...that Moody's has reconfirmed the Village's Aa+ bond rating, which is the highest rating available to a non-home rule village of our size.

### The Annual State of the Village: 2016 in Review

2016 has certainly been a productive and forward-moving year in the Village of Barrington.

I am pleased to report that the [Barrington Village Center at Hough and Main is now 92% leased](#), and its stores and restaurants are bustling!

In addition, [49 new businesses opened](#) in the Village (including 3 restaurants). Our overall office occupancy per Lake County Partners' 4th quarter 2016 report was 88.8%, while [retail occupancy was 93.7%](#).

[Barrington's White House met its fundraising goal with \\$6.8 million raised](#) in private donations, and more than 7,000 visitors have made their way through this beautiful building so far.

[The median housing price for sales closed in January 2017 was 7.3% higher than the median price for sales closed in January 2016](#). In December, the Village closed on the sale of the former Adco site to Monroe Development (Liberty and Hough Streets), where a 64-unit luxury residential building is currently being constructed.

We continued to work on major infrastructure projects in 2016, and the results of those efforts will be evident in the following projects in 2017, 2018, and beyond:

- >> [Major sewer replacement](#) from West Liberty to Summit in 2017 – 2018
- >> [New entrance to the commuter lot](#) with traffic signal on Route 14 just south of the animal hospital – final engineering and land acquisition in 2017
- >> [A new traffic signal](#) will be installed at the Grove/ Dundee intersection in 2017
- >> [The Hart Road/ Route 14 intersection improvement with sidewalks along Hart Road](#) and around the Barrington High School campus to Main Street is on for 2018
- >> [The Route 14 underpass of the CN rail line](#) project continues with an additional \$4 million acquired in 2016 from IDOT for land acquisition

The overall strong financial position of the Village was acknowledged in December 2016 after a review by [Moody's reconfirmed the Village Aa+ bond rating](#), which is the best rating we can achieve as a non-home rule municipality of our size.

Of course, we still have challenges to address. [Public safety pension funds](#) for our community are completely subject to laws passed by our state legislature (as to benefits, retirement ages, disability rules), but taxpayers in our community are responsible for making sure the pension funds are fully funded. The Village contributions to these funds has increased at an average annual rate of 10.2% since 2007. In order to address the unsustainable amount of growth in this cost, our Village is working with other municipalities for state legislation for the consolidation of over 650 separate pension funds across the state into a consolidated fund which will reduce pension fund administrative costs and increase investment returns.

[Another challenge continues to be the additional CN freight traffic](#) coming through town. We continue to work on the infrastructure improvement – the Route 14 underpass – which can have the greatest overall impact on traffic congestion reduction and emergency access.

[I would like to thank our entire Village Board and staff](#) for their tremendously capable efforts this year. Their work has made our Village safer, more attractive, cleaner, financially sound, entertained, culturally more satisfied, and better informed. [I'd also like to give a heartfelt thanks to our many volunteers](#) through the Village: we thank you for the hours you give and the heart you keep in our Village. Working together, we can achieve our community's goals to make Barrington a great place to live, work, and play.

## An Update on the CN Rail / Route 14 Underpass Project

Village of Barrington President Karen Darch, who has long been an advocate of Barrington's concerns regarding the extraordinary increase in Canadian National train traffic across the EJ&E tracks that cross our community in multiple locations, reports that the planning phases are still ongoing to construct an underpass at Route 14 and the CN tracks.

The project also incorporates a proposed realignment of Lake Zurich Road out to Route 14 that would relocate the intersection to a traffic signal in order to mitigate the high number of traffic accidents at its current location.

The Village is working with IDOT, the Surface Transportation Board, affected property owners and other organizations in the vicinity to provide the best and most comprehensive solution to this project.

Of the total \$62 million cost for this long-term underpass project, the Village of Barrington anticipates spending approximately \$400,000 for construction, with the remainder of the funding from grants, as well as federal and state agencies, and the CN railroad.

"We are so pleased to see this modern residential apartment complex being built on the former ADCO property," says **Peg Blanchard**, the Village of Barrington's Director of Economic Development. The complex is within walking distance of the Village Center and will allow residents to enjoy all the activities, restaurants, and entertainment options that Barrington has to offer."

The developer will be setting up a leasing office in Barrington, and they anticipate the project to be available for occupancy in early 2018. ## Major Sanitary Sewer Project to Begin This Spring

# VILLAGE NEWS YOU CAN USE

## Overnight Parking in the Village: The Rules & Regs

The Village of Barrington allows on-street parking throughout the day. However, overnight parking is not allowed on any village street outside of the central business district, including residential areas and all public streets outside of the downtown area, from the hours of 1:00 a.m. – 6:00 a.m. Parking is not allowed in the central business district from 2:00 a.m. – 5:00 a.m.

There are several reasons the Village does not allow overnight parking without prior approval. First and foremost, our Public Works department must be able to facilitate street sweeping and snow removal; the streets must be clear in order to safely conduct these operations.

Second, the Village is simply more attractive when vehicles are not left outside on the streets and are instead safely parked in driveways.

And finally, when vehicles are parked or abandoned on the street at night, they can be targets of theft and vandalism.

If you occasionally must park on the street for driveway repairs or for out of town guests, please just call ahead at (847) 304-3300. Provided the privilege isn't abused, the Village will typically grant such requests.

## Refuse, Recycling, & Composting Programs Available



### Refuse/Recyclable Collection Pick-up:

Please have your refuse and recycling containers at the curb on Friday before 6:30 a.m., but no more than 24 hours before pickup. Do not place any containers in the street. Promptly remove your empty bins from the curb after pick-up.

**Electronics Recycling Program:** Groot will pick up unlimited electronic waste at the curb at no additional charge. Residents can simply call Groot at (800)244-1977 to schedule a pickup 24 hours in advance.

**Yard Waste/Food Scrap Composting Program:** This program runs from March 17, 2017 until mid-December 2017. Yard waste includes grass clippings, weeds, leaves, and small twigs. Residents will also be permitted to place "acceptable" food scrap materials inside of their compost cart. Collection will continue to occur on Fridays along with refuse and recycling pickup.

## It's Time to Weather the Spring Storms

We all know that thunderstorms can produce rapidly changing and life-threatening conditions, including lightning, heavy rains, flash floods, high winds, hail, and tornadoes.

The Barrington Breakfast Rotary Club has graciously supplied the Village with **ten lightning detection devices that are located at all local schools and parks.** The local system is designed to predict a lightning strike within a defined area.

**When the conditions for a lightning strike exist, the system will give a 15-second blast on the horn cluster.** If you hear the Lightning Prediction System activate, you should immediately seek shelter inside. Once the potential for a lightning strike has passed, the system will activate the horns for an all-clear signal – three short blasts – and the strobe light will go off. The lightning prediction system is the only local warning system that has an all-clear signal.

**There are seven tornado warning sirens located within the Village.** The steady tone is used to alert the public that a tornado has been sighted and is approaching the community. This tone will last three to five minutes. **When the steady siren is heard during severe weather, you should immediately seek a place of shelter.** After securing shelter, listen to cable TV, weather alert radios, or AM/FM radio stations for emergency information. There is NO all-clear siren tone. Listen to local radio or cable television for all-clear information. The outdoor warning sirens are tested the 1st Tuesday of every month at 10:00 a.m. **If the steady tone is heard at any other time, it is a signal that an emergency is occurring within the community.**

Only 1% of U.S. tornadoes reach "violent" intensity, yet those few result in 70% of all tornado deaths. Winds in these tornadoes can exceed 200 mph and can stay on the ground for an hour or more. **If a tornado is spotted, take shelter in a substantial building, ditch, ravine, or other low spot** (be cautious of flash flooding). Residents are also reminded to review their individual family preparations by visiting [www.ready.gov](http://www.ready.gov) to prepare, plan, and stay informed.



### WATCHES AND WARNINGS: KNOW THE DIFFERENCE

**A Severe Thunderstorm Watch** occurs when conditions are ideal for severe weather to develop.

**A Severe Thunderstorm Warning** occurs when severe weather is imminent, seek shelter immediately.
