Re-Imagining Barrington's "Town Warming"

This February, the Barrington Cultural Commission is re-creating the Barrington Town Warming concept on **Saturday, February 3, 2018**, with a one-day speaker series at the White House that is designed to bring the community out in the middle of a cold winter to learn about some important topics affecting our community, our citizens, and our world today.

The "Town Warming" originated in Barrington during the days of the Great Depression in the 1930s. Before television and even widespread radio, leaders in Barrington were looking for ways to rejuvenate the community in the midst of a cold winter through topics of the day presented by excellent and nationally known speakers.

Thus was born the "Barrington Town Warming." According to Lisa Stamos's account in *Quintessential Barrington* magazine, "The first Barrington Town Warming was held in January 1939. **Two civic-minded businessmen of Barrington felt that a need existed – not only in their community, but in America – for a rebirth of the early American town meeting.** Taking clues from the earlier Methodist campground meetings and the Chautauqua revivalist models, Barrington's Town Warmings were a success and may have lit the civic and cultural fire that burns in our community today."

The article continues, "Endorsed by nearly all of the late 1930s and early 1940s Barrington organizations, including churches, the newspaper, schools, Junior Women's Club, the library, and Jewel Tea Co., the Town Warmings were 'so stimulating, so satisfying, so American,' that they continued for several more years... **they attracted the nation's most influential business, religious, academic, and civic leaders**, who in turn, stated enthusiastically that these meetings ought to happen across the United States following Barrington's successful model."

The Cultural Commission is excited to be reviving this important part of our history and our community life on February 3. While we can't reveal our slate of speakers just yet, we can promise you that **we have lined up an impressive group of individuals from the Barrington area and beyond**, including high-profile figures in business, politics, academics, and community life. They will all assemble at Barrington's White House for a day-long immersion into our community featuring a keynote address and panels centered around the topic, "Reality Check: Where We Are Today and Our Vision for the Future."

While we anticipate that space will be very limited for this extraordinary event, I would like to invite you to save the date for Saturday, February 3, and join us in the conversation. And please, **consider inviting a young person to attend with you.** As our "baby-boomer" generation continues to advance in age, we believe it is more critical than ever to engage our youth in opportunities that will help illuminate the critical issues of our day and will help them become stewards of our community in the future.

Look for more information on the Town Warming in the months to come. I look forward to seeing you there for a lively discussion!

It's Winter Once Again in Barrington: Friendly Reminders

Winter Garbage Placement

During the winter months, garbage pickup is more difficult due to snow and ice conditions. The Village respectfully requests that **residents place all garbage and recycling containers on the driveway or parkway adjacent to the street.**

Do not place the containers on the street, as this can create a hazardous condition for snow plowers and residents. Thank you!

Sidewalk Snow Removal

Like most municipalities in northern Illinois, the Village requires residents and business owners to clear snow and ice from the sidewalks adjacent to your property.

Keeping your sidewalk clear is important for preventing hazardous conditions for pedestrians. Please do your part to help **assure the safety of your neighborhoods and customers by making sure your sidewalk is promptly cleared.**

During significant snow events, check the Village's Facebook page, watch Channel 4, and go to the Village's website at www.barrington-il.gov for detailed storm information.

Snow Piled at End of Driveways

Because there are more than 3,800 driveways in the Village, we do not have enough equipment and personnel to clear snow at the end of driveways. **We recommend waiting until the street has been plowed from curb to curb before clearing your driveway.** Please do not shovel snow back into the street, as it can cause frozen road hazards.



Keep Fire Hydrants Clear

Please keep fire hydrants near your property or in your neighborhood clear of snow. This will greatly help firefighters in case of an emergency.

Holiday Light Recycling Program

The Barrington Public Works Department partners with Elgin Recycling to establish a "Holiday Light Recycling Program." Drop off your used holiday lights at the main entrance of the Public Works Facility, 300 N. Raymond Avenue, from November 20, 2017 through March 20, 2018. Accepted for recycling will be: mini-lights (or Italian lights), C7 lights, C9 lights, rope lights, LED lights, and extension cords. All colors and lengths will be accepted. The Village will not accept garland, live greens, wreaths, or other non-recyclables. Safety First at the Holidays

Remember to keep safety first at the holidays with these tips:

- >> Decorative lights should never be used on metallic trees.
- >> Do not use indoor lights outdoors. All outdoor lights should be weatherproofed. All decorative lights should be UL approved.
- >> Place Christmas trees away from fireplaces and keep them watered.
- >> Candles should never be used on or near Christmas trees or decorative garlands. Use only flame-retardant or non-combustible decorations.
- >> Keep presents and gifts away from lighting. Be sure that the gifts themselves are fire-safe.
- >> Keep small, choking-hazard ornaments away from lower tree branches where children might reach them.
- >> Turn off your indoor decorative lights when away from home.

Fireplace Safety

At the holidays and throughout the winter, remember that when burning firewood, a tar-like material called creosote builds up on the chimney walls. If left to build up over time, creosote will eventually heat up and cause a fire in the chimney or attic. To avoid a creosote buildup in your fireplace, it's best to professionally have your fireplace cleaned by a chimney cleaner (also referred to as a chimney sweep). This should be done at least annually, depending on the type of tree, the age, and the amount of wood being burned.

Village Participates in Chicago ICSC Event to Recruit Businesses

The International Council of Shopping Centers (ICSC) has a P3 Retail Partnership Program within the organization focused on building a stronger partnership with the public sector to foster retail development as economic development. Through the P3 and the active participation by our staff and municipal leaders in "deal-making" events, we become more involved in understanding how to attract retail businesses to our community.

This past September, Village representatives attended the Chicago Deal-Making event at Navy Pier to market and promote available retail sites in an effort to recruit select retailers that residents would like to see in our community.

ICSC identifies retail as "a catalyst for economic development" and the importance of "building strong public/private partnerships." Our involvement and presence at these events shows a commitment that Barrington is actively dedicated and serious about recruiting new retail opportunities. It is our chance to showcase our community's available opportunities and network with shopping center owners, developers, managers, retailers, and other community leaders.

Attending the ICSC program has been helpful to the Village with its economic recruitment efforts. We believe in the ICSC P3 Retail Program, whose mantra is "Public Sector plus the Private Sector equals Economic Success."

The new concept opened Tuesday, October 17.


Shop Small Business Saturday - November 25

PARKING & CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

Winter Parking Regulations November 1 through March 31

To allow snow plows to safely maneuver and clean the streets for emergency response vehicles, parking is not permitted after 1:00 a.m. on streets within the Central Business District when snow accumulation is over two inches, until snow removal operations are complete.



In addition, parking is not permitted at any time on residential streets outside of the Central Business District when snow accumulation is two inches or more, until snow removal operations are complete. As a reminder, parking is always prohibited on all Village Streets between the hours of 1:00 a.m. until 6:00 a.m. Village snow removal crews typically complete post storm clean-up of Village streets during the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. after the storm has ended. Please refrain from parking on the street until after all snow and ice control efforts have been completed.

North Commuter Lot Update

As has been previously communicated, the North Commuter Lot will continue to experience closures throughout the winter until the Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project is completed in Spring 2018.
