The evening will feature a spectacular live auction item – the 5-Day Cynthia Rowley New York Fashion Experience, plus a special piece from her collection.


The goal is to raise significant funds to launch the new Friends of Barrington's White House, a 501(c)(3), whose mission is to support both the Capital

## What's Happening with Our Infrastructure Projects in Barrington?

The warmer weather has finally arrived here in Barrington, and people are out and about enjoying all that Barrington has to offer. As I make my way around the Village, I'm often asked about the various infrastructure projects that are in the works to help improve the lives of all our residents.

Below I'll give you some updates on the projects and their timing. But first it's worth noting that **many of our "Village" projects actually involve many local, state, and federal agencies to complete**, including the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT), the Army Corps of Engineers, the Federal Highway Administration, private landowners who must provide easements or sell land for the project, and many others. In addition, **the Village usually pays for only between 0 and 20% of these projects**, which puts control less in our hands and more in the hands of the agencies putting in the most money. For that reason, it often takes a herculean effort (and several years) to accomplish these types of projects. So when construction timelines go off track, it's usually because of factors outside our control, such as the State of Illinois' recent budget crisis. Here is an update on major projects and their current timing:

- Hart Road/Route 14 Intersection and Sidewalk Improvements:** Exciting news! All the land acquisitions have been completed for this project, and the Village will be signing an Intergovernmental Agreement with Lake County at its June Board meeting. This means that the project will go to construction "letting" (bidding) in November, with actual construction to begin in summer 2019. This improvement includes adding several new turn lanes to this dangerous intersection as well as additional sidewalks along Route 14 from Cumnor Avenue to Hart Road, and a sidewalk along Hart Road from Northwest Highway to the north parking lot at Barrington High School. Phase II of this project will include a sidewalk along the entire length of Hart Road from Barrington High School turning onto Lake-Cook Road to meet the existing sidewalk at Hager Rd.
- "Safe Routes to School" Sidewalk Project:** More good news! This project is currently underway with land acquisition, and construction is expected to begin in 2019. It includes sidewalks on Lageschulte Street from Main Street to Lincoln Avenue and on Illinois Street from Grove Avenue to Summit Street.
- New North Commuter Lot Entrance:** This project will create a new entrance to the Metra North Commuter Lot with a traffic signal at Route 14 near Barrington Animal Hospital. Land acquisition for the project will soon be underway; provided there are no delays with land acquisition, construction could start as soon as summer 2019.
- Dundee Road / Grove Avenue Traffic Signal:** This project will place a light on Dundee Road at Grove Avenue and also provides for a multi-use path along Dundee from Barrington Road to Barrington Middle School. This project is 100% under the control of the State of Illinois and subject to their timing. At this time, the project is expected to begin in spring 2019.
- Lake Zurich Road Re-Routing Project:** This project would re-route Lake Zurich Road to intersect with Route 14 at the Berry Road light in order to improve intersection safety. In April, the Barrington Area Library Board voted to cease negotiations with the Village regarding this safety improvement, therefore the re-routing is currently under reconsideration.
- Route 14 Underpass at the CN Tracks:** This project will create an underpass on Northwest Highway (Route 14) under the Canadian National railroad tracks in order to alleviate train traffic congestion as well as to provide one open route through town when a train passes through. This project's start date depends on the acquisition of the federal, state, and other grants needed to complete it. Currently the Village is pursuing grant opportunities that could make significant funding available for this project as soon as summer 2019. This is a separate project from this year's upcoming CN and IDOT maintenance work along U.S. Route 14.

I am always willing to listen to our residents' questions and concerns about the projects underway in the Village. I hope you will contact me with any questions you may have.

## Tips for Proper Lawn Care to Minimize Stormwater Runoff Issues

Excess fertilizers and pesticides applied to lawns and gardens wash off and pollute streams. In addition, yard clippings and leaves can wash into storm drains and contribute nutrients and organic matter to streams.

- >> **Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly.** When use is necessary, use these chemicals in the recommended amounts. Use organic mulch or safer pest control methods whenever possible.
- >> **Don't over-water your lawn.** Consider using a soaker hose instead of a sprinkler.
- >> **Compost or mulch yard waste.** Don't leave it in the street or sweep it into storm drains or streams.
- >> **Cover piles of dirt or mulch** being used in landscaping projects.

## Call Before You Dig!

Doing projects outside your home this summer, such as decks and patios, trees or shrubs, swing sets, signs, fountains, tents, fences, mailbox posts, room additions, gardens, swimming pools, landscaping, etc.?



To avoid personal injury and damage to underground electric, gas, sewer, and telecommunications lines, state law requires you to contact JULIE before any digging project, regardless of the project size or depth. You must then wait 2 working days for Julie to mark your digging location.

Simply call 8-1-1 or 1 (800) 892-0123 to place a locate request. Both the call and JULIE's services are free. Please call before you dig this summer!

## Sign Up for the NEW Reverse 911 System to Get Emergency Notices

As your Village Manager, it's important to me that Barrington residents have the information they need about everything going on in the Village, from Public Works projects and street closures, events, and breaking news such as major weather events or urgent police or fire situations. We have a number of communication tools that we use to provide information, including the newsletter you're reading now, which is currently mailed to all residents. In addition, we have a number of other tools we use to communicate:

### NEW Reverse 9-1-1 System for Urgent Communication

The Barrington Police Department has recently changed its "Reverse 911" emergency notification provider. It's important that ALL residents visit [www.barrington-il.gov/Reverse911](http://www.barrington-il.gov/Reverse911) to sign up for the new system (even if you were on the old system) in order to sign up to be alerted about emergencies and other important community news. This system enables us to provide you with texts, phone calls, and emails to get critical information to you quickly in a variety of situations, such as severe weather, unexpected road closures, missing persons and evacuations of buildings or neighborhoods.

### Social Media: Facebook, Twitter, and Next Door

Over the past year, we've significantly increased our presence on social media. Here you'll find breaking news as well as posts about local happenings and events. If you haven't followed us yet at "Village of Barrington," please be sure to do so – when things are happening in Barrington, you'll want to turn here first!

### Bi-Weekly E-Newsletter

The Village also sends a bi-weekly E-Newsletter to our residents (every other Friday). Currently we have more than 4,500 subscribers on our e-mail list. But you won't receive it if you don't sign up, so please subscribe by going to [www.barrington-il.gov](http://www.barrington-il.gov) and click on "quick links" at the top of the page.

Participation in all of these services is 100% free and completely voluntary. You can opt-out at any time. We know that maintaining the privacy of your personal information is important, and rest assured that the Village of Barrington will not share your information with anyone.

### Barbara L. Benson Historical Lecture Series



## SUMMER CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

### DETOUR! Route 14 to Close at CN Tracks June 4-8 Railway Maintenance Means a One-Week Detour First Week in June

Canadian National Railway has informed IDOT and the Village that the rail crossing adjoining Jewel Park will be closed at Northwest Highway (Route 14) June 4-8 for maintenance purposes. This is a complete closure of Route 14 for the entire week, with traffic being detoured to Route 59 and Main Street. Route 14 will remain open east of Route 59 until the rail crossing and north from Main Street to the crossing, but for local traffic only. There will be no access for through traffic. In addition, this summer IDOT will be completing routine re-paving and maintenance of Route 14, which will close certain lanes at various times. Stay tuned for additional updates.

### Russell/Summit Street Area Set to Reopen in July Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project Comes to an End

The Village's Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project is scheduled to be completed in July (weather-dependent). Currently construction is ongoing on the south side of the Metra tracks in Miller Park and adjacent areas of Summit Street, Lincoln Avenue, Russell Street, and Spring Street. Due to this construction, a section of the South Commuter Parking Lot remains closed to accommodate necessary equipment, staging, and work to be done in the coming months.
