

Lake Zurich Road Re-Alignment and the Route 14 Underpass: *Working for the "Greater Good": Updates on These Important Improvements*

As this issue of the Village newsletter is going to press, we are anxiously awaiting the Barrington Area Library's April 23 vote on the Intergovernmental Agreement to support the re-alignment of Lake Zurich Road to intersect with Route 14 at the Berry Road traffic signal.

The Library's approval is the last piece of the puzzle needed to move this project to the construction phase, and we certainly hope that the Library's board will have agreed that the greater good of our entire Barrington-area community is served by this project.

As many of you may know, our community has been working on this important safety issue for many years. Quite simply, the intersection of Lake Zurich Road and Route 14 is one of the most dangerous in our community. Addressing this issue has had stops and starts for more than 20 years, and the Library has now been presented with a plan that enjoys broad-based community support.

The time to act is now, because the project is fully funded via federal, state, and local funding sources. However, the money is available on a "use it or lose it" basis. If we do not receive the Library's cooperation to move forward, the funding will be directed to other regional highway projects as soon as this month. I sincerely hope that as you are reading this, the Library will have voted YES to this project so that we can complete these important improvements.

This brings me to the question of the Route 14 underpass. As I am out and about in the community, I hear a variety of conversations about the underpass. Some of our residents believe it may never happen; some believe it is 20 years out; and some just aren't sure where the project stands.

It's important for everyone in our community to know that the underpass project has been approved by IDOT and is moving forward as we speak. In fact, IDOT has already worked cooperatively with several Jewel Park homeowners to pay a very fair price to acquire five of the eight homes that will be needed to construct the underpass. Those five homes are slated to be demolished this spring.

In the spirit of the "greater good," I'd like to thank all of the residents of Jewel Park. I know that this project has more impact on some areas than others, but moving forward cooperatively is helpful as we try to address Barrington's long-term train issues.

We continue to seek funding to move the underpass project forward more quickly: We have grant applications pending for federal and state infrastructure funds; an appeal in the 7th Circuit Court of Appeals attempting to receive funds from CN for the project; and plans to apply to a regional fund for significant projects like ours in the next several months. The more numerous, longer, and slower CN trains we see each day are a constant call to action for these continued efforts.

Are You Feeding Your Prescriptions to the Fish? Info on Proper Disposal of Pharmaceuticals

An increasing number of drinking water sources across the country contain traces of pharmaceuticals. Currently the levels are not known to affect human health, but studies show that these contaminated water supplies are negatively affecting aquatic life. Additionally, putting antibiotics into the environment aids in the development of drug-resistant germs.



The Barrington Area Council of Governments (BACOG) advocates taking steps to protect our community's groundwater from pharmaceutical contamination.

Do not flush or toss! Septic systems and municipal wastewater treatment plants do not remove all pharmaceutical components, and the water released from a treatment plant or a private septic system contains remnants of flushed medications that may enter the groundwater. Throwing medicine away also is not a safe practice. Landfills produce a liquid by-product that is comprised of everything in the landfill including pharmaceuticals, which can enter surface waterways or leach directly into the ground and our drinking water.

Where can I dispose of my pharmaceuticals? Dispose of your pharmaceuticals at an official take-back location. The [Barrington Police Department](#), along with many other police departments and public service buildings in the BACOG area, collect unused pharmaceuticals.

Fire Hydrant Flushing Schedule

April 17 – April 27 (10:30 p.m. - 7:00 a.m.)

Flushing will occur in the Village of Barrington, Paganica of Barrington Hills, and Braymore, Weatherstone, Glencrest, and Sanctuary of Inverness

April 30 - May 2 (6:30 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.)

Flushing will occur in Abbey Woods and Estates of Inverness Ridge

The Village conducts an annual flushing of the water distribution system to eliminate as much mineral content as possible from the domestic water supply. Fire hydrant flushing removes a considerable amount of loose mineral content and “settleable” solids that accumulate in the water supply system over a period of time.

Flushing will occur from April 17 through May 2 (as listed above, weather permitting). You may experience discoloration, low water pressure, and rusty water during flushing operations. This may occur during the entire flushing period, even when flushing may not be in your immediate area. Although water may be discolored, it is safe to drink; however, until the water runs clear, you should avoid washing clothes, especially whites. Call Public Works at (847) 381-7903 for more info.

Spring Chipper Schedule

Monday, May 7 - North of Main Street

Monday, May 14 - South of Main Street

Please have all your branches and material out to the curb by 7:00 a.m. on your designated Monday morning. The Chipper will make only ONE pass through your neighborhood. Branches may be up to 10” in diameter and at least 4’ in length.

Stack branches neatly in a long, low pile on the parkway, with the cut end facing the curb. Public Works crews cannot pick up material on private property. The following items cannot be picked up: root balls and stumps; building materials; anything with nails, wire or bolts; any materials placed in a box or garbage can; grass; leaves; or any materials other than wooded branch materials. Remember to utilize your Groot yard waste tote throughout the season.

Why pay for mulch when you can get free wood chips from the Village? Stop by the Public Works facility on Raymond Avenue today.

Got Coyotes?

There have been several recent reports involving coyotes and foxes in the Village. There are no known incidents of these animals attacking humans in Illinois, and these animals actually provide a benefit by preying on small mammals.

They also feed on geese eggs, which helps to control the geese population. Although it is safe to live near these wild animals, please do not attempt to feed them, and keep small animals on a leash outdoors. For more information, go to www.coyotesmarts.org/what-to-do/.



The Parents Circle Families Forum is a joint Israeli-Palestinian organization made up of more than 600 bereaved families. Their common bond is that they have lost a close family member to the conflict. But instead of choosing revenge, they have chosen a path of reconciliation. Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project Update

Work continues until this summer on south side of tracks

The Village's Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project continues this year on the [south side of the Metra tracks](#) in Miller Park and adjacent areas of Summit Street, Lincoln Avenue, Russell Street, and Spring Street. Due to this construction, [a section of the South Commuter Parking Lot remains closed](#) to accommodate necessary equipment, staging, and work to be done in the coming months. The Village has secured additional temporary parking spots which will be available by South Commuter Permit only (go to www.barrington-il.gov/parking).

The improvements include increased stormwater volume within Miller Park, sanitary sewer, storm sewer, and water main improvements throughout the surrounding areas, and road reconstruction over all new utility improvements, including Summit Street between Lincoln Avenue and Russell Street, Russell Street between Spring Street and Summit Street, and Lincoln Avenue between Spring Street and Summit Street.

The project is currently scheduled to be completed this summer, though all work is weather dependent and the time line may be altered as necessary. The Village appreciates your continued understanding and cooperation throughout this extensive undertaking.
