Barrington Adds More Commuter Parking

New Parking Program Provides More Options and a Designated-Space Premium Parking Permit

Due to increased demand for commuter parking, the Village of Barrington has purchased a parking lot from the First Church of Christ Scientist. This lot is adjacent to Barrington's North Commuter Parking Lot and will add 67 additional commuter spaces to our commuter parking. The lot will be under construction through the summer and will be available for parking on October 1, 2019.

The addition of this new lot has allowed the Village to comprehensively re-examine its current parking options and offerings. Beginning October 1, 2019, here's what's new for commuter parking in Barrington:

NEW: Premium Commuter Parking (Purchase Your Very Own Spot!)

The Village of Barrington will now offer its commuters a new Premium Commuter Parking Permit which allows commuters to purchase a guaranteed, reserved single spot near the train depot in either the North or South Commuter Lots for the entire year.

A limited number of spots in five zones are available for \$1200 per year (go to www.barrington-il.gov/parking to view map). Premium parking purchasers will have access

to their reserved spot until 9:30 a.m. each day during regular commuter hours, after which time their spot will be released for the day and open to the public. This option will provide additional spaces for those wishing to park after 9:30 a.m. Permits will be assigned via random lottery. Village of Barrington residents will receive first priority in the lottery; BACOG residents are second priority; and all others are third priority.

If you would like to purchase a Premium Commuter Parking Permit, lottery applications must be submitted with a 10% deposit (\$120) no later than June 28, 2019 at 4:30 p.m. Reserved spots will be available on October 1; the balance of the payment will be charged on August 20. Applications can be found on the Village of Barrington web site.

NEW: Daily Spots Available in Both North and South Commuter Lots

Daily parkers will now be able to park in both the North and South Commuter lots on a first-come, first-served basis for \$3.50 per day, a 50-cent increase.

This increase will be used to pay for the purchase of the additional 67 spaces in the new parking lot, as well as ongoing maintenance of the parking lot. It will also be used to fund the addition of an improved entrance to the North Commuter lot (with traffic signal) near the current Barrington Animal Hospital, which will provide additional ingress/egress to the commuter lot each day. In addition, the Train Station will be receiving an additional enhancement in 2019-2020 of heat lamps on the platforms.

NEW: Prepaid Parking Quarterly Program: Available in Both North and South Commuter Lots

Beginning October 1, the South Commuter lot will no longer be a

BACOG-only lot. Anyone may park in either

the North or South Commuter lots on a daily fee basis, or they may pay quarterly on pre-paid basis for a discount. Paying by quarter does not reserve a specific spot for a parker, but rather grants access to either the North or South Commuter lot on a first-come, first-served basis. Pre-paying provides the added convenience of not having to pay each day at the fare boxes.

NEW: Ability to Purchase Parking Permit Online

Beginning October 1, parkers will have the ability to purchase permits online rather than in person.

BACOA DEBUTS SENIOR CITIZEN “EASY RIDERS” RIDE SERVICE PROGRAM

Barrington area senior citizens will now enjoy access to “Easy Riders,” a new transportation program made possible through a partnership between the Barrington Area Council on Aging (BACOA), SYNERGY HomeCare and Lake Barrington Shores.

The “Easy Riders” program provides rides to BACOA events, local errands, and appointments (including medical visits). Rides in the Barrington area are free. Older adults in need of assistance that may require a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) are charged rates set by SYNERGY HomeCare, which provides a CNA for each ride. Lake Barrington Shores residents may also receive round trip rides from a Lake Barrington Shores volunteer, for a cost of \$5.

Seniors in need of the ride service may call the BACOA office at (847) 381-5030 to reserve their spot. Rides should be requested at least one week in advance, so volunteers have time to arrange their schedules.

The Barrington Area Council on Aging promotes vibrant, healthy aging by providing activities, education, and support to older adults and caregivers. Established in 1985, BACOA serves approximately 1,400 clients annually in the northwest suburbs of Chicago. TIPS FOR PROPER LAWN CARE TO MINIMIZE STORMWATER RUNOFF ISSUES

Excess fertilizers and pesticides applied to lawns and gardens wash off and pollute streams. In addition, yard clippings and leaves can wash into storm drains and contribute nutrients and organic matter to streams.

- > Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly; if used, apply chemicals only in the recommended amounts. Use organic mulch or safer pest control methods whenever possible.
- > Don't over-water your lawn. Consider using a soaker hose instead of a sprinkler.
- > Compost or mulch yard waste. Don't leave it in the street or sweep it into storm drains or streams.
- > Cover piles of dirt or mulch being used in landscaping projects.

KNOW WHAT'S BELOW... CALL "JULIE" BEFORE YOU DIG

Doing an outdoor project? Illinois law requires that you call JULIE at 811 two business days before you dig, or go to illinois1call.com. A representative from each member utility company will mark the location of their facilities with paint and/or flags. Member utility locators should always have clearly visible identification and rarely need to enter your home to complete a locate request.

Excavation should be carefully performed only after confirming that all member utilities have marked the location of their underground lines or notified you that they have no buried lines in the area. Call center agents are available 24/7/365.

OWN A DRONE? RULES YOU SHOULD KNOW

As drones have become a more prevalent part of our society, it is important for residents to understand the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) laws that govern these "Small Unmanned Aircraft Systems" (or "sUAS"). These laws protect the safety and privacy of individuals in the area where drones are being flown. Below is a summary for safely and lawfully flying a drone:

- You must register your drone with the FAA
- You must complete training and obtain a Remote Pilot Certificate from the FAA
- You may not fly near other aircraft or over people
- Drones may not be flown over private property without the owner's consent
- Prior to flight, the operator should identify potential hazards, property ownerships, takeoff and landing sites, ground control markers, and conduct advanced flight planning
- You may only fly a drone within a visual line-of-sight
- You may not fly in controlled airspace near airports without FAA approval
- You may not fly more than 400 feet in height without FAA approval
- You may only fly during daylight or twilight
- The drone must weigh less than 55 pounds
- Most drones cannot fly in any rain, winds over 22 mph, or temperatures below 35 degrees

GRILLING SAFETY Be Safe This Summer

Summer months mean grilling! But keep in mind that grills can be very hot and can cause burns and fire injuries. Keep these tips in mind so you and your family can enjoy summer vacations, picnics, camping, and just being outdoors!



1. Use propane, charcoal, and wood pellet barbecue grills outdoors only!
2. Keep grills at least **three feet away** from your house and anything that can burn.
3. Keep children and pets at least **three feet away** from the grill when it's hot.
4. Stay with the grill the entire time you're cooking.
5. Keep your grill clean so leftover grease and fat won't catch on fire.

Special concerns for charcoal grills:

- > For charcoal grills ONLY use charcoal starter fluid. Never use any other flammable liquid to start the fire.
- > Keep charcoal fluid, matches and lighters out of sight and out of reach of children.
- > Done grilling? Let the coals cool completely, then dispose in a metal container.

Special concerns for propane grills:

- > Check the propane tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year.
- > Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting the grill.
- > If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call 911. Do NOT move the grill.


