

201 S. Cook Street – Contributing



At this location is a two-story rectangular commercial building with Italianate influence that dates to 1873, according to the sign on the building. The main (W) façade has a central recessed entrance with paired multi-light glass and wood doors with a segmental arched multi-light transom and flanked by glass and wood display windows framed by Tuscan columns. At the second story above the entrance is a span of three eight-over-eight wood sash windows. Above the center window is a multi-light arched transom. The display windows have a bracketed cornice. On the side elevation there are no first floor windows but on the second floor there are one-over-one wood sash windows. The building has an aluminum siding exterior.

Attached at the rear is another commercial building with a poured concrete foundation and an entrance on the building's north elevation. This building also has a false roofline with a stepped parapet and brackets. The entrance is a recessed ca. 1980 nine-light glass and wood door. Above the door is a rectangular multi-light arched transom. The entrance is flanked by display windows set in a wooden frame with milled posts and a bracketed cornice. A pedestrian entrance at the far rear of the north elevation has a ca. 1980 nine-light glass and wood door. On the rear of the south elevation is a two-story frame wing.
