

## 207-209 S. Cook Street – Contributing



At this location is a two-story, frame, Queen Anne style dwelling constructed ca. 1862 according to the sign on the building and currently used for commercial purposes. The building has a stone foundation, a hip and gable of asphalt shingles, an interior brick chimney and an exterior of weatherboard siding. On the main (W) façade is a partial-width, hipped roof porch with milled wood posts and railings. A decorative wood valence has been added to the porch. The main entrance has an original glass and wood door with raised panels. A secondary entrance with an identical door leads to a small entry porch/stoop also on the west elevation. Windows are original, one-over-one double hung wood sash, some with rectangular stained glass transoms. The house has a large band of decorative shingles above the first floor windows and in the gable fields.

On the south elevation, the projecting gable bay has a cutaway bay window on the first floor. On the rear of the south elevation is a two-story, porch with milled wood posts. A portion of the first story of this porch is enclosed. The upper story has a simple wood board railing and an entrance that retains its original single-light glass and three wood door. The first floor, enclosed porch has a two-vertical light and wood panel door. At the basement level are three-light awning glass and wood windows.
