

## 401 S. Cook Street – Contributing

**ARC 12-05** – Remove several windows, second floor door and metal spiral staircase on the south elevation and replace a window on the north elevation.

Located at 401 S. Cook Street is a two-story rectangular American Foursquare dwelling built ca. 1900. The house has a continuous stone foundation, a hipped roof of asphalt shingles and an exterior of aluminum siding. The main (W) façade has a full-width, gable roof porch with a small projecting gable over the entry stairs. The porch was rebuilt ca. 1985 with chamfered wood columns, a milled wood, cut-out railing and eave brackets. In the gable field of the porch are sawtooth vertical boards. The main entrance has a ca. 1925, multi-light glass and wood door. On the main façade is a large, fifteen-light fixed glass and wood window flanked by four-light casement windows. Over this window is an original dentilled cornice with corner blocks. Other windows in the dwelling are ca. 1960, nine-over-nine and six-over-six rectangular double hung wood sash windows with dentilled cornices and corner blocks and flanking wood louvered shutters on the main façade. On the south façade is a ca. 1960, two-story metal stair leading to an entrance added ca. 1960.

Off the southeast corner of the dwelling is a ca. 1970, frame garage with a hipped roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior of aluminum siding and a metal panel overhead track door. At the roof's peak apex is a louvered vent cupola with a metal finial.
