

## 407 S. Cook Street – Contributing



Located at 407 S. Cook Street is a two-story, frame, gabled ell Folk dwelling built ca. 1890. The house has a continuous rock-faced concrete foundation, a gable and hip roof of asphalt shingles and an exterior of vinyl siding. The main (W) façade has a ca. 1930, sun porch with one-over-one fixed windows, a frame skirt wall and a ca. 1990, single-light and aluminum storm door with two-over one glass and wood sidelights. The main entrance has an original, single-light and three-wood panel glass and wood door. Windows are original, one-over-one rectangular double hung wood sash with wood cornice surrounds with flanking wood shutters on the main facade. On the main and south façades are projecting, hipped roof bay windows with three, one-over-one double hung wood sash windows supported by fan brackets. At the roofline on the main façade is a gable roof dormer with a single-light, rectangular fixed light with an aluminum awning. On the rear façade is a frame porch with square wood posts, wood railings and a gazebo on the south façade.



At the rear is a frame one-story, two-bay garage built ca. 1920 with paired hinged doors, a side gable roof, a central metal flue and a wood pergola extending off the west façade. **Contributing**
