

## 412 S. Cook Street – Contributing



At this location is a two-story rectangular American Foursquare style dwelling built ca. 1915. The house has a continuous concrete covered stone foundation, an interior brick chimney, a hipped roof of asphalt shingles and an exterior of vinyl siding. On the main (E) façade is a full-width, one-story, hipped roof porch with original Tuscan columns and a square wood baluster railing. The house was built with two main entrances; both located on the first floor with one leading to the second floor. The entrance to the first floor retains its original single-light and three-panel glass and wood door, while the entrance to the second floor has a ca. 1930, wood panel door. On the south façade is a ca. 1950, secondary entrance with a three-light glass and wood door. Windows are ca. 2003, one-over-one double hung vinyl sash with vinyl-clad surrounds. On the main and south facades are original bay windows with replacement one-over-one double hung vinyl sash windows. At the roofline of the main façade is a gabled wall dormer with a rectangular vent.



Located to the rear of the dwelling is a ca. 1970, frame, two-story garage with a hipped roof of asphalt shingles and overhead metal panel track doors.
