

508 S. Cook Street – Contributing



Located at 508 S. Cook Street is a ca. 1905, two-story, frame American Foursquare with a continuous stone foundation, an interior brick chimney, a hipped roof of asphalt shingles and an exterior of weatherboard siding. On the main façade is an original, hipped roof porch with Tuscan wood columns and square wood baluster railings. The main entrance has an original single-light glass and wood door. Windows are original, one-over-one double hung wood sash with simple wood cornice surrounds. On the north façade is an original, two-story bay window with three, one-over-one double hung wood sash windows. On the south façade is an original, one-story bay window with three, one-over-one double hung wood sash windows with original single-light, transoms with original leaded glass. On the south façade is a secondary entrance with an original single-light glass and wood door. At the roofline are hipped roof dormers with single-light rectangular fixed windows.

Located off the southwest corner of the dwelling is a ca. 1970, single-bay, frame garage with an exterior of asbestos shingles siding, a front gable roof of asphalt shingles and an overhead metal panel track door.
