

516 S. Cook Street – Contributing



Located at 516 S. Cook Street is a two-story rectangular American Foursquare dwelling constructed ca. 1910. The dwelling has a continuous rock-faced concrete block foundation, an interior brick chimney, a hipped roof of asphalt shingles and an exterior of weatherboard siding. The full-width, hipped roof porch has an original weatherboard skirt wall, square Doric-motif wood columns and added screen panels. The main entrance has an original single-light oval glass and wood door. Windows are original, one-over-one double hung wood sash with wood cornices. On the north façade is an original bay window with three, one-over-one double hung wood sash windows. At the roofline on the main façade is a hipped roof dormer with a triple set of single-light fixed windows. On the rear façade is an original, single-story wing.

Off the southwest corner of the dwelling is a ca. 1950, single-bay, frame garage with a front gable roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior of stucco, a three-horizontal-light and three-horizontal-wood panel pedestrian door and a ca. 1980, metal panel overhead track door. **Noncontributing**
