

517 S. Cook Street – Contributing



At this location is a two-story Craftsman dwelling built ca. 1930. Originally a gable front plan, the house has an addition, a continuous foundation of rock-faced concrete block, a gable roof of asphalt shingles, an interior brick chimney and an exterior of vinyl siding. On the main façade is an arched recessed entry bay with a tapered wood post on a wood pier. The main entrance has an original three-light and wood panel door. Windows are ca. 1990, three-over-one vertical-light double hung vinyl-clad sash. In the gable fields are ca. 1990, fish scale shingles. On the north façade is a ca. 1990, shed roof dormer and on the main façade is a triangular dormer at the ridgeline and a gable roof wall dormer with a six-over-six double hung wood sash window and fish scale shingles in the gable field.

To the rear of the dwelling is a ca. 1990, frame, single-bay garage with an exterior of vinyl siding, a front gable roof of asphalt shingles, an overhead metal panel track door and a vinyl clad octagonal window in the gable field.
