

## 529 S. Cook Street – Contributing



Located 529 S. Cook Street is a one-and one-half-story gable front Craftsman dwelling built ca. 1915. The house has a continuous rock-faced concrete block foundation, a cross gable roof of asphalt shingles, an interior brick chimney and an exterior of vinyl siding. On the main façade is an original, hipped roof sun porch with square wood columns, a frame skirt wall and one-over-one fixed glass and wood windows. The main entrance retains its original six-light and wood panel door. Windows are original, one-over-one double hung wood sash. At the eaves are knee brace brackets. On the north and south facades are gable roof dormers.

To the rear of the dwelling is an original, two-bay, frame garage with an exterior of weatherboard siding, a side gable roof of asphalt shingles and exposed roof rafters, a gable roof dormer at the roofline with a four-light fixed glass and wood window and wood panel overhead track doors. Knee brace brackets are in the eaves of both the dormer and the roofline. **Contributing**
