

## 539 S. Cook Street – Contributing



**ARC 05-12** – two-story addition to the east (rear) of the primary structure

Located at 539 S. Cook Street is a one-and one-half-story side-gabled Craftsman dwelling built ca. 1920. The house has a continuous concrete foundation, a gable roof of asphalt shingles, an interior brick chimney and an exterior of stucco. On the main (W) façade is a full-width, inset porch enclosed ca. 1970, for use as a sun room with original stucco-covered columns and closed railing, one-over-one double hung wood sash aluminum windows and a single-light aluminum and glass storm door. The main entrance retains its original, four-light glass and wood door. Adjacent to the door is an original diamond-light window and a one-over-one double hung wood sash window with a diamond-pattern upper sash. Other windows in the dwelling are original, three-over-one vertical-light double hung wood sash. At the eaves are knee brace brackets. At the roofline on the main façade is a gable roof dormer with a set of four, three-over-one vertical-light double hung wood sash windows and knee brace brackets.

To the rear of the dwelling is an original frame garage with a hipped roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior of stucco and a ca. 1970 roll-up metal door. At the roofline of the main façade is an elliptical window dormer.
