ARC 06-17 – rear two-story addition (preliminary review only)

ARC 08-20 – rear two-story addition, front porch rehabilitation, window repairs. Addition and alterations completed in 2010.

Located at 546 Cook Street is a two-story rectangular American Foursquare constructed ca. 1905 with a continuous rock-faced concrete block foundation, a hipped roof of asphalt shingles, an interior brick chimney and an exterior of weatherboard siding. On the main (E) façade is a full-width, hipped roof porch with original milled columns, a wood floor, square wood baluster railings and a frieze with square spindles. The main entrance retains its original single-light glass and wood door with an aluminum and glass storm door. Windows are original, one-over-one double hung wood sash with wood cornices. Windows on the first floor of the main façade are fixed-light design with a leaded glass transom over the window on the north bay. On the south façade is an entrance with an original, single-light and three-wood -panel door. At the roofline on the main façade is a hipped roof dormer with two, single-light fixed windows.

To the rear of the dwelling is an original, frame, two-bay garage with a hipped roof of asphalt shingles with exposed roof rafters, an exterior of weatherboard siding and ca. 1980, metal panel overhead track doors. **Contributing**
