

603 S. Cook Street – Noncontributing



At this location is an asymmetrical two story Colonial Revival dwelling built ca. 1915. The house has a concrete block foundation, a gable roof of wood shingles, an exterior wall brick chimney and an exterior of wood shingles. The main entrance has a recessed entry with engaged columns and a wood surround and an original glass and wood panel door with a leaded glass elliptical transom. Windows are original, six-over-six and six-over-nine double hung rectangular wood sash. The north bay of the first floor has a six-over-nine double hung wood sash window flanked by two-over-three glass and wood sidelights. At the eaves are gable returns. At the roofline on the main façade is a gable roof dormer with a six-over-six double hung wood sash window. On the south and north facades are gable roof wall dormers with original windows.

At the rear of the dwelling is an original, one-and one-half-story, frame, two-bay garage with a wood shingle exterior, overhead wood panel garage doors and a fifteen-light window with a wood cornice surround on the main façade. **Noncontributing**
