

619 S. Cook Street – Contributing



Located at 619 S. Cook Street is a one-and one-half story, frame, gable front Folk dwelling built ca. 1905. The house has a continuous poured concrete foundation, a cross gable roof of asphalt shingles, an interior brick chimney and an exterior of weatherboard siding. On the main (W) façade is a ca. 1980, hipped roof with a partial-width enclosed section containing the main entrance with a wood panel door. Windows are ca. 1980, one-over-one double hung vinyl sash with wood surrounds and flanking louvered shutters on the main facade. Also on the main façade is a large picture window with flanking shutters and added muntin bars to give a twenty-light fixed glass effect. On the south façade is a hipped roof bay window with three, one-over-one double hung vinyl sash windows. On the north and south facades are gable roof wall dormers with a paired set of windows. On the rear façade is an original, single-story wing and a one-story entry porch beneath the gable roof wall dormer with square wood post supports.



To the rear of the dwelling is a ca. 1980, frame, single-bay garage with a metal panel overhead track door, an exterior of vinyl siding, a hollow core wood pedestrian door and an exterior of weatherboard siding.
