

631 S. Cook Street – Contributing



Located at 631 S. Cook Street is a two-story, frame, gable front Folk dwelling built ca. 1915. The house has a continuous brick foundation, a front gable roof of asphalt shingles, an interior brick chimney and an exterior of wood shingle siding. On the main (W) façade is a ca. 1980, projecting gable roof entry bay with a wood panel door, stone deck and wrought iron railings. Windows flanking the entry have been enclosed with wood panels. Windows on the main section of the house are six-over-six double hung wood sash with wood cornice surrounds. On the first floor of the main façade are paired, four-over-four double hung wood sash flanked by narrow, four-over-four double hung wood sash windows. On the south façade is a ca. 1950, single-story, gable roof wing with an exterior of wood shingles and an exterior wall brick chimney. In the gable fields are apex louvered attic vents.

To the rear of the dwelling is a ca. 1990, frame, single-bay garage with an exterior of wood shingle siding, a front gable roof and no visible door. **Noncontributing**
