

634 S. Cook Street – Contributing



At this location is a two-story, frame, gable front Folk dwelling built ca. 1905. The dwelling has a continuous rock-faced concrete foundation, a gable roof of asphalt shingles and an exterior of weatherboard siding. The main (E) façade has a full-width, hipped roof porch with ca. 1990, milled wood columns and baluster railings and a wood floor. The main entrance has a ca. 1990, wood panel door. Windows are ca. 1990, vinyl clad sash in a one-over-one and six-over-six double hung design. A square louvered attic vent is located in the gable field.

To the rear of the dwelling is a ca. 1990, frame, two-bay garage with an exterior of weatherboard siding, overhead metal panel track doors, a front gable roof of asphalt shingles and a louvered vent in the gable field. **Noncontributing**
