

640 S. Cook Street – Contributing



Located at 640 S. Cook Street is a two-story side-gabled central hall plan Folk dwelling built ca. 1930. The house has a continuous rock-faced concrete block foundation, a gable roof of asphalt shingles, an interior and an exterior wall brick chimney and an exterior of vinyl siding. The main entrance retains its original four-vertical-light and wood panel door flanked by Doric pilasters and an enclosed sidelight. Above the entrance is an original, metal, pent roof. Windows are original, paired sets of one-over-one double hung wood sash with added shutters and wood cornice surrounds. At the roofline of the main façade is a gable roof wall dormer in the central bay with a louvered apex vent below which is a small, one-over-one, double hung wood sash window. At the main entrance are a ca. 1960, concrete deck and wrought iron railing.

At the rear of the dwelling is an original, frame, single-bay garage with a front gable roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior of weatherboard siding and a wood panel overhead track door.
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
