ARC 10-14 – Relocate existing one-car garage to rear of property. Construct two-car garage addition to existing one-car garage.

ARC 11-09 – Add chimney to the north elevation. Add several windows and one door to the south and west elevations.

Located at 644 S. Cook Street is a one-and one-half-story side-gabled Craftsman dwelling of ashlar-faced concrete block construction built ca. 1930. The house has a continuous poured concrete foundation, a gable roof of asphalt shingles with exposed roof rafters and an exterior of ashlar-faced concrete block. The main entrance has a ca. 1980, fifteen-light glass and wood door with a wood surround. On the main façade are two, triple sets of original, three-over-one vertical-light double hung wood sash windows with wood surrounds. Remaining windows in the dwelling are original, three-over-one and one-over-one rectangular double hung wood sash with wood surrounds. The half-story has an exterior of original asphalt shingles. At the roofline on the main façade is a gable roof dormer with a decorative asphalt shingle exterior and a paired set of one-over-one wood double hung wood sash windows with wood surrounds. A recessed entry with a concrete lintel is located on the south façade.

To the rear of the dwelling is an original, concrete block garage with a front gable roof of asphalt shingles with exposed eave rafters and an overhead metal panel track door. **Contributing**
