ARC 09-05 – addition of front and rear dormer

Located at 648 S. Cook Street is a one-story, rectangular Craftsman dwelling built ca. 1930. The dwelling has a continuous rock-faced concrete block foundation, a hipped roof of asphalt shingles, an interior central brick chimney and an exterior of weatherboard. On the main (E) façade is an original, inset sun porch with weatherboard siding and original, four-over-one vertical-light double hung wood sash windows. The main entrance has a ca. 1980, fifteen-light glass and wood door with glass and wood sidelights, a concrete stoop and wrought iron railings. Windows are original, four-over-one vertical-light double hung wood sash with wood surrounds. On the north façade is a gable roof dormer with a paired set of original windows and weatherboard and rolled asphalt siding.

Located off the northwest corner of the dwelling is a one-bay, frame garage with an exterior of rock-faced concrete block, a gable roof of asphalt shingles with exposed roof rafters and an original overhead wood track door of four-section of six-lights over six inset wood panels. **Noncontributing**



Attached on the south façade of the garage is a single-story, front gable plan, rusticated, hollow-core concrete block dwelling built ca. 1930. The dwelling has a front gable roof of asphalt shingles, an interior brick flue and original, one-over-one double hung wood sash windows. The main entrance has a solid wood door. Located in the gable field is a single-light fixed window and vertical board siding. **Contributing**
