

116 Coolidge Avenue – Noncontributing



Located at 116 Coolidge Avenue is a one-story gabled ell Colonial Revival influenced dwelling built ca. 1955. The dwelling has an exterior of aluminum siding, a gable roof of asphalt shingles, a continuous concrete foundation and an interior concrete chimney. On the main (S) façade is an inset entry with a single square wood post, wood milled brackets, a concrete floor and steps and a wide wood cornice. The main entrance has a wood panel door concealed by an aluminum and screen storm door. Adjacent to the door is a projecting bay beneath the front gable which has a large two-over-two horizontal-light, double hung wood sash window flanked by two-over-two horizontal-light double hung windows with two-over-two double hung horizontal-light windows on the sides; all original. The remaining windows in the dwelling are original, two-over-two horizontal light double hung wood sash with simple wood surrounds and flanked by louvered wood shutters. On the gable field of the main façade is board and batten siding and a rectangular louvered metal attic vent.

Off the northeast corner is an original single-bay, frame garage with an exterior of aluminum siding, a front gable roof of asphalt shingles and a ca. 1980, metal panel overhead track door.
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
