

124 Coolidge Avenue – Contributing



Located at 124 Coolidge Avenue is a 1-1/2 story, frame, gable front Folk dwelling constructed with Craftsman influences ca. 1915. The house has a clipped gable roof of asphalt shingles, a continuous foundation of rock-faced, hollow core concrete block, an interior brick chimney and an exterior of vinyl siding. On the main (S) façade is a full-width, hipped roof porch with original, tapered wood columns and a solid wood railing covered with aluminum siding. The main entrance retains its original, eight-light and wood panel Craftsman style door. Windows are original, one-over-one rectangular double hung wood sash with one-over-one storm windows. On the lower façade of the main façade is a bay window with three, one-over-one wood double hung sash windows. At the roofline on the east façade is a large, ca. 1970, shed roof dormer with metal sash windows.



To the rear of the dwelling is an original, frame, single-bay garage with an exterior of shiplap siding, a hipped roof of asphalt shingles and an original, twelve-light glass and six-vertical wood panel overhead track door.
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
