

206 Coolidge Avenue – Contributing



Located at 206 Coolidge Avenue is a one-story, frame, gabled ell Tudor Revival dwelling built ca. 1930. The house has a continuous foundation of rock-faced, hollow core concrete block, a gable roof of asphalt shingles and an exterior of wood shingles. On the main (S) façade is an inset entry porch on the east façade of a gabled projecting bay. This entry porch has two, arched openings and a column covered with wood shingles. The main entrance retains its original arched, four-panel wood door set within an arched surround. Windows are original, six-over-one rectangular double hung wood sash with simple wood surrounds. On either side of the chimney are stained glass windows. Beneath the windows on the main façade are wood flower boxes. On the rear façade is a ca. 1950, shed roof addition.



Located to the rear of the dwelling is an original, two-bay, frame garage with a front gable roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior of shiplap siding and original overhead track wood panel garage doors. Located in the gable field are natural birdhouses. **Contributing**
