

230 Coolidge Avenue – Contributing



This is a one- and one-half-story, frame side-gabled Folk dwelling built ca. 1930. The dwelling has a steeply pitched roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior of weatherboard siding, an exterior brick chimney, and a stucco-covered, continuous foundation. The main entrance is centrally located on the south elevation and has a gabled entry porch with Tuscan columns and an arched ceiling. A wooden railing lines the porch and wood steps. The entrance has an original, three-vertical light glass and wood paneled door. On the east elevation is an original one-story wing. Windows are original three-over-one-vertical-light double hung wood sash. On the rear elevation, is an original, one-story enclosed porch with eight-light glass and wood windows. A ca. 2003, new frame deck is also located off the rear elevation.



To the rear of the dwelling is an original, two-bay, frame garage with a side gable roof of asphalt shingles, an exterior of weatherboard siding and two, ca. 1990, overhead track metal doors. **Contributing**
