

238 Coolidge Avenue – Contributing



Located at 238 Coolidge Avenue is a two-story, frame, gable front Folk dwelling built ca. 1880. The house has a front gable roof of asphalt shingles, an interior brick chimney, a continuous stone foundation and an exterior of masonite siding with a permastone skirt wall on the main façade. The main (S) façade has a gable roof canopy over the main entrance supported by wood brackets, concrete stairs and a wrought iron railing. The main entrance has a ca. 1960, three-rectangular-light diagonal line glass and wood door. Windows were replaced ca. 1960 which included an installation of a large central single-light fixed picture window with flanking two-over-two double hung wood sash windows on the main façade's first floor. This dwelling was extensively altered ca. 1960 and has lost most of its historic fabric and detailing. On the rear façade is a ca. 1960, single-story, gable roof addition with a lateral wing that attaches a ca. 1960, single-bay garage with a twelve-wood panel and four-light overhead track door and a single-light and wood panel pedestrian door. An entry on the west façade has a shed roof porch supported by a single milled wood post. .
