

239 Coolidge Avenue – Contributing



This is a two- and one-half story, side-gable with wings, Colonial Revival dwelling built ca. 1930. The house has a side gable roof of multi-colored slate shingles, a continuous brick foundation, a brick exterior and two exterior end brick chimneys. The main entrance is centrally located on the north elevation and has an original wood paneled door flanked by original four-light glass and wood panel sidelights. The entrance leads to a small entry porch with an arched roof supported by square wood posts. Windows are original six-over-one double hung wood sash with brick sills. Upper floor windows have wood plank shutters with three-leaf shamrock cutouts and are set within a shed roof wall dormer. On both the east and west elevations are one-story flat roof wings. At the basement level beneath the eastern wing is a garage bay with an original six-light and eighteen-panel wood and glass garage door. Fanlight attic windows flank the chimney at the attic level on both the east and west elevations. The house has a belt course of soldier course brick above the first floor windows. Poured concrete walls extend from garage bay along driveway.
