

109 Dundee Avenue – Contributing



At this location is a gabled ell Folk Victorian dwelling with Italianate influence, built ca. 1890. The house has a brick foundation, a gabled roof of asphalt shingles, an interior central brick chimney and an exterior of weatherboard siding. On the main (W) façade is a shed roof porch with wrought iron columns and handrails, concrete block piers with wood slat infill and a wood floor. The main entrance has a three-light, glass and wood door with an original, single-light glass and wood sidelight. On the north façade is a shed roof bay window with decorative brackets and cornice and original, two-over-two double hung wood sash windows. On the main façade are arched wood cornices with brackets, wood lintels, two-over-two vertical-light and two-over-one double hung arched wood sash windows.
